Aberdeen, Feb. 13. The Duke of Argyll has received a Letter from Major-General Evans, giving an Account, that the Party of Rebels which he purfued, got to Fraserburg a March before him, and when he arrived there were gone to Bamf. Hereupon he detached after them Colionel Campbell of Fanab, with 40 Dragoons and 400 Foot, and is himfelf returning hither with 160 Dragoons : The Pretender's Phyfitian furrendred to him at Fraferburg. This Afternoon the Duke of Argyll had Intelligence from Collonel Grant who is in Possefion of Castle-Gordon, that General Gordon and the main Body of the Rebels having come that Way, were marched up Strath-Spey and Strath-Don; which dis concluded muft be with an Intent to separate and retire each Clan to their own Country. Hereupon the Paffage being left clear betwixt this Place and Inverness, his Grace deligns to order four Battallions and one Regiment of Dragoons defigned to be quartered in that Part of the Country, to march on the 15th Inftant towards Inverness: And the reft of His Majefty's Troops will forthwith be fent into the Quarters affigned them. Major Urquhart, Smith of Methwen, Bennerman of Ellick and his Brother, and Fotheringham of Pourie, have come in and furrendred themfelves.
