Vienna, Feb. 15. Letters of the 28th paft from Cronstat on the Frontiers of Transilvania advise, that Prince Stephen Cantamzeno, who fucceeded the late Prince of Walachia, and had been one great Occasion of the Difgrace and terrible Execution of him and his whole Family, had been feized in like Manner on the 26th, and carried away to Conftantinople, with his Wife, Children, and whatever belonged to him. The Hofpodar of Moldavia, Nicholas Maurocordato, is made Prince of Walachia; and Michael Beig, a Mative of Moldavia, and Son in Law of Maurocordato, is made Holpodar of Mol-davia. A Relation of the deposed Prince of Walachia, endeavoured to fave himfelf on Horfeback with a great Sum in Gold, but had the Misfortune to get a Fall just on the Frontiers of Transilvania, and was taken and carried after the reft by the Turks.

Genoa, Feb. 18. On the 15th arrived here the Worcefter, a British Man of War Commanded by Captain Kempthorn, who 18 Days before left Admiral Baker at Port-Mahon. The faid Man of War will make but a fhort Stay here, being ordered to proceed to Leghorne. About 5000 of the Em. perour's Troops, came lately to Novi with-in the Territories of this Republick ; but fome Agreement being made with them, till a Courier returns from Vienna with His Imperial Majefty's Anlwer to the Offers of Satisfaction made to Him by this State, those Troops are marched back to the Milaneze.

Drefden, Feb. 19. To Day Thirty Colours, Two Standards, a Kettle Drum, and Two Pieces of Cannon, which fell to the Share of King Augustus's Troops, as Part of those taken from the Swedes at Rugen and at Strallund, were brought through this City; and having been carried before the Queen at the Castle, were afterwards lodged in the Arlenal. Letters from Warlaw advile, that the King of Poland arrived there on the 7thof this Month. Ratisbon,
