

(b) reduce the parking charge at the 2-hour pay and display (ticket) parking places operated by the City of Westminster in Lincoln's Inn Fields from £2.40 per hour to £2 per hour.

The general effect of the Parking Places Order would be to extend certain residents' parking places in Hanson Street and Molyneux Street.

The general effect of the Disabled Persons' Free Parking Place Order would be provide:

- (a) a disabled persons' parking place in Bolsover Street.
- (b) that the vehicles which may be left in the disabled persons' parking places shall be those displaying either a valid permit issued by the Westminster City Council (commonly known as the "white Westminster Exemption Badge") or a disabled persons badge issued by any local authority (commonly referred to as the "orange badge") and that they may be left without charge;

The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Amendment Order would be further to amend the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, so that the solo motorcycle area in Molyneux Street would be revoked.

The general effect of the Diplomatic Missions Free Parking Place Order would be to provide a diplomatic parking place in Great Portland Street at which only those vehicles used by the Head and members of staff at diplomatic missions may be left at any time, without charge or time limit.
