PROVISION OF DISABLED PERSONS PARKING PLACES IN RIDGWAY. WIMBLEDON AND CONNAUGHT GARDENS, MORDEN

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Merton, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of power conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 have made the above-mentioned Order on 25th October 1995. The Order will come into operation on 30th October 1995.

The general effects of the Order will be to:

- (a) designate places in the roads described in the Schedule to this notice in which vehicles authorised by the Order may be left for any period during the permitted hours without charge;
- (b) provide that the parking places will operate at all times;

- (d) provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances, e.g. to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 20 minutes), etc.

Exemptions to the provisions of the Order are given for emergency vehicles and anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

A copy of the Order, the Council's statement of reasons and a plan of the area affected by the Order, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays until the 8th December 1995 in the main reception, Merton Civic Centre, London Road, Morden, Surrey. The notice of proposals appeared in *The London Gazette* on 29th June 1995, Issue no. 54087, Ref. 854.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
