#### SCHEDULE

(Prohibition of Slow Moving Vehicles)

Prohibit all vehicles incapable by design of exceeding a speed of 25 m.p.h. (40 k.p.h.):

A45 Nene Valley Way, eastbound carriageway, from its junction with the exit slip road at Barnes Meadow Interchange to its junction with the entry slip road at Great Billing Way Interchange.

A45 Nene Valley Way, westbound carriageway, from its junction with the exit slip road at Great Billing Way Interchange to its junction with the entry slip road at Barnes Meadow Interchange.

The total distance of the restriction is approximately 5.5 kilometres (3.5 miles).

The entry slip road from its junction with Barnes Meadow Roundabout to its junction with the eastbound carriageway of A45 Nene Valley Way.

The entry slip road from its junction with Lumbertubs Way Roundabout to its junction with the eastbound carriageway of A45 Nene Valley Way.

The entry slip road from its junction with Great Billing Way Roundabout to its junction with the westbound carriageway of A45 Nene Valley Way.

The entry slip road from its junction with Lumbertubs Way Roundabout to its junction with the westbound carriageway of A45 Nene Valley Way.

## Statement of Reasons

Slow vehicles travelling on the A45 Nene Valley Way between Lumbertubs Way Interchange and Barnes Meadow Interchange and intending to continue on A45 travel in the centre lane of the three lane carriageway.

The difference in speed between these vehicles and normal traffic creates a hazardous situation when other drivers are overtaking, joining the main carriageway or changing lanes. Safety for all drivers will be improved and congestion reduced by prohibiting vehicles which cannot, by design, exceed 25 m.p.h. (40 k.p.h.).

Slow vehicles affected by the restriction will be diverted off A45 and signed via local roads to rejoin beyond the restriction.
