The Stopping-up of Highways (Batchelor Road, Gabalfa, Cardiff, South Glamorgan) Order 1995

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, to authorise the stopping-up of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice.

The stopping-up is authorised only in order to enable retail/leisure development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Chelverton Properties Ltd by Cardiff City Council on 30th March 1995, under reference 94/01443/W.

Copies of the made Order and the relevant plan may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Cardiff City Council, Planning and Development Department, Wood Street, Cardiff, or may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Phase 1, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting reference ZC 510-5-7-33).

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provisions contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990; or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act,

he may, within 6 weeks of 10th November 1995, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
