The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the
 Queen's Gallantry Medal to:

Captain Michael John LOBB (527146) Corps of Royal
 Engineers.

Captain Lobb was the Duty Bomb Disposal Officer 33 Engineer
 Regiment (EOD) on 21st March 1995 when he was tasked to an
 unexploded bomb on the island of Portland, Dorset.
 Reconnaissance revealed that it was German Second World War
 Spreng Dickenwand five hundred kilogramme bomb with an
 unidentifiable fuse. On Captain Lobb's advice Dorset Police
 decided to evacuate all personnel within one thousand metres
 radius of the bomb during the period that he would attempt to
