MEDICINES ACT 1968

European Pharmacopoeia: Approved Synonyms

The Health Ministers, that is to say the Secretaries of State concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland respectively and the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, hereby declare under section 65(8) of the Medicines Act 1968 that the Medicines Commission has approved as a synonym for a name in the left-hand column of the list set out below (being a name at the head of a monograph in the European Pharmacopoeia), the name or names corresponding to it in the right-hand column of that list, with or without any of the following modifications:

(a) a change in the order of the words in the right-hand column,

with the addition of a preposition if necessary;
(b) the use of the syllable "sulf" instead of "sulph" and vice versa;
(c) the use of the syllable "cef" instead of "ceph" and vice versa; (d) the use of square brackets for round brackets and vice versa,

(e) the use of diphthongs where "ac" or "oe" appear in combination:

(f) the use of the symbol "%" instead of the words "per cent";
(g) the use of the abbreviation "Inj" instead of the word
"Injection".

The subject matter of the list set out below shall take effect on 1st January 1996 and is supplementary to the list of Approved Synonyms published in 1988.

The Health Ministers, that is to say the Secretaries of State concerned with health in England, Wales and Scotland respectively, and the the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, hereby declare under section 65(7) and (8) of the Medicines Act 1968, that on and after 1st January 1995, the monographs contained in the nineteenth fascicule of the Second Edition of the European Pharmacopoeia, published under the direction of the Council of Europe (Partial Agreement) in accordance with the Convention on the Elaboration of a European Pharmacopoeia, together with the amendments and addition to the Second Edition of the European Pharmacopoeia adopted by the European Pharmacopoeia Commission on 30th June 1995, and referred to in the Schedule hereto, are to have effect for the purposes of section 65 of the said Act.
