Notice of application to vary a licence to abstract water

Take notice that Worlick Farm Ltd., of The Estate Office, Abbots Ripton Hall, Abbots Ripton, Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire, is applying to the National Rivers Authority to vary licence serial number 6/33/53/106/9 to abstract water from the drains of the Ramsey 2nd (Stocking Fen), and The Whittlesey Internal Drainage Boards between National Grid References TL 2901 8568 and TL 2904 8621, between TL 2935 9010 and TL 2886 9071 and between TL 2876 9062 and TL 2973 9041 at Stocking Fen and Marriots Drove in Ramsey Parish, Huntingdonshire District, Cambridgeshire.

The variation being applied for is to add a further abstraction point at National Grid Reference TL 2883 8493 on the Bury Brook and a further area on which the water may be used as spray irrigation and the use of a permanent pump at this point. AMBER VALLEY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Amber Valley Borough Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (No. 3) Order 1995

Notice is hereby given that on 21st December 1995, Amber Valley Borough Council made the above-named Order, pursuant to section 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and Regulation 25 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1989.

The Order will give effect to those proposals advertised in Issue No. 54083 of *The London Gazette* dated 26th June 1995, under Ref. No. 725 but which were subsequently deferred as follows: the proposals in respect of the car park at Mosley Street, Ripley.

The Council has previously introduced the Amber Valley Borough Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1995, which came into force on Monday, 2nd October 1995, and the Amber Valley Borough Council (Off-Street Parking Places) (No. 2) Order 1995, which came into force on Monday, 6th November 1995.

The proposals in respect of the car park at Fletcher Street, Heanor, remain deferred.

Copies of the Order, together with the relevant maps and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order may be inspected, during normal office hours at the Town Hall, Market Place, Ripley, or at the Council's Town Centre Bureaux, at Heanor Town Hall, Market Place, Heanor; King Street, Belper, or Alfreton House, High Street, Alfreton.

The Order made will come into force on Monday, 8th January 1996.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order, or any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act, or that a requirement thereof, or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to this Order, may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application to the High Court for this purpose.

AVON COUNTY COUNCIL

Avon County Council (Glenarm Road, Brislington, City of Bristol) (South Eastern Zone) (Prohibition of Driving) (Variation No. 2) Experimental Order 1996.

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd January 1996, the County Council of Avon made an Order under section 9 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which for a maximum period of 18 months from 6th February 1995 (operative date of original Experimental Order), is to vary further the County Council of Avon (Glenarm Road, Brislington, City of Bristol) (South Eastern Zone) (Prohibition of Driving) Experimental Order 1995, so as to prohibit any vehicle, except pedal cycles, from entering, proceeding or waiting, in that length of Glenarm Road, Brislington, which extends from a point 90 metres north of Brislington Hill (A4) northwards for 3 metres. The existing exemptions will apply.

Objections and representations to the Experimental Order as varied continuing indefinitely, together with the grounds which they are made, should be sent in writing to the undermentioned address quoting ref. NMT/EP/2/145 by 8th July 1996. The County Council of Avon will consider in due course whether the provisions contained in the Experimental Order as varied should be continued indefinitely. At that time any objections and comments received will be given consideration. Please note that all representations received may be considered in public by the County Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.

The Order will come into operation on 15th January 1996, and a copy thereof, together with a map and a copy of the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order and a copy of the Order to be varied may be inspected at the undermentioned offices (callers should report to Reception and ask for the Statutory Orders Section), during normal office hours and at the Public Library, Wick Road, Brislington, during normal opening hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any of the relevant requirements of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks after the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
