A P R O C L A M A T I O N,

For Apprehending *William Mackintosh*, commonly called *Brigadier Mackintosh*, *Charles Wogan*, *James Talbot*, *Robert Hepburne*, *William Delmahoy*, *Alexander Delmahoy*, *John Tasker*, and *John Mackintosh*.

WHereas *William Mackintosh*, commonly called *Brigadier Mackintosh*, who is a Tall Raw-Boned Man, about Sixty Years of Age, Fair Complexioned, Beetle-Browed, Grey-Eyed, speaks Broad Scotch, *Charles Wogan*, *James Talbot*, *Robert Hepburne*, *William Delmahoy*, *Alexander Delmahoy*, *John Tasker*, and *John Mackintosh*, who were lately Committed to the Goal of Newgate for High Treason, in Levying War against Us within this Realm, &c, on-Friday the Fourth Instant, make their Escape out of the said Goal; We have therefore thought fit, with the Advice of our Privy-Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby Requiring and Commanding all Our Loving Subjects whatsoever, to use their utmost Endeavour to Discover and Apprehend the said *William Mackintosh*, *Charles Wogan*, *James Talbot*, *Robert Hepburne*, *William Delmahoy*, *Alexander Delmahoy*, *John Tasker*, and *John Mackintosh*, and to carry them before One of Our Justices of the Peace, who is hereby required to Commit them to the next Goal for the said High Treason, there to remain till they shall be discharged by due Course of Law; of which such Justice of the Peace is hereby required to give immediate Notice to One of Our Principal Secretaries of State. And for the Encouragement of all Persons to be Diligent and Careful in endeavouring to Discover and Apprehend the said Persons, We do hereby further declare, That whoever shall Apprehend and bring before such Justice of the Peace, the said respective Persons, or any of them, shall have and receive for such of them, so to be Apprehended and brought before a Justice of Peace, the Rewards following, That is to say, for the said *William Mackintosh*, the Sum of One thousand Pound; and for each of them the said *Charles Wogan*, *James Talbot*, *Robert Hepburne*, *William Delmahoy*, *Alexander Delmahoy*, *John Tasker*, and *John Mackintosh*, the Sum of Five hundred Pound: Which Rewards the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby Required and Directed to Pay accordingly.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Fifth Day of May, 1716. In the Second Year of Our Reign.

Westminster, May 7. This Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne, with the usual Solemnity,

Sir William Oldes, Gentleman-Usher of the Black-Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for charging and continuing the Duties on Malt, Mum, Cyder and Perry, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixteen, and for compelling several Receivers to finish and clear their Accounts; and for making Duplicates of Exchequer-Bills, Lottery-Tickets, and Orders lost, burnt, or destroyed; and for enlarging the Time for adjusting Claims to certain Benefit-Tickets; and for allowing the Charge of executing the Lottery-Act for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ten; and for recovering Monies of several Land-Taxes resting in the Hands of Collectors or Constables at St. Adrians; and for preventing Frauds in the Duties upon Soap; and for limiting a Time for Persons who have certain Annuities for Life or Lives to demand the Payments thereupon at the Exchequer; and for preventing Frauds in the Duties relating to Printed and Painted Paper, Callicoes, and other Things therein mentioned.

An Act to enable His Majesty to grant the Regalities and Lands now remaining in the Crown in North Wales, and South Wales, and County of Chelter, to His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, in such Manner and Form as the Principality of Wales and Earldom of Chelter have formerly been granted to the Princes of Wales; and also to enable His said Royal Highness to make Leases of Lands, Parcel of His Royal Highness's Duchy of Cornwall, or annexed to the same.

An Act for enlarging the Time of Continuance of Parliaments, appointed by an Act made in the Sixth Year of the Reign of King William and Queen Mary, intituled, An Act for the frequent Meeting and Calling of Parliaments.

An Act to indemnify such Persons who have acted in Defence of His Majesty's Person and Government, and for the Preservation of the Publick Peace of this Kingdom, in and about the Time of the late unnatural Rebellion, from vexatious Suits and Prosecutions.

An Act for the Attainder of *George Earl of Marischal*, *William Earl of Seaforth*, *James Earl of Southesk*, *James Earl of Panmuir*, and others, of High Treason, unless they shall render themselves to Justice by a Lay certain therein mentioned.
