#### Noak Bridge Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that Basildon District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") has authorised the designation of Noak Bridge, Basildon, as a Conservation Area, with effect from January 1996.

The Conservation Area includes the entire Noak Bridge estate; comprising all dwellings in Aylesbury Mews. Bridgecote Lane, Bridge Street, Coppice Lane, Crouch Street, Durban Lane, Fore Street, Gate Lodge Square, Gate Lodge Way, Kenilworth Place, Kimberley Drive, Littlehurst Lane, Lower Street, New Waverley Road, Saling Green, Tudor Court, and those properties fronting Wash Road between Bridge Street and Kimberley Drive. Together with Noak Bridge Primary School, Noak Bridge Village Hall, Doctors Surgery and 147, 149 Coppice Lane.

Again, with very few limited exceptions, trees may not be topped, lopped, felled, up-rooted or wilfully damaged or destroyed unless 6 weeks notice of the proposed action has been given to the Local Planning Authority.
