TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of areas of highway and footpath at, or in the vicinity of Doxford Park, Sunderland, Tyne and Wear.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted to David Lyons & Associates, acting as agents for Doxford Park Investments ref. 95/1037.

Copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours during 28 days commencing on 14th February 1996, at the offices of the City of Sunderland Council, Department of Administration, Civic Centre, Burdon Road, Sunderland SR2 7DN, and may be obtained, free of charge, from the Department of Transport (quoting ref. DN5038/35/1/458), at the address stated below.

Any person may object to the making of the proposed Order within the period of 28 days commencing on 14th February 1996, by notice to the Secretary of State for Transport, quoting the above reference, at the office of the Director Planning, Environment and Transport, Government Office for the North East, Wellbar House, Gallowgate, Newcastle upon Tyne NEI 4TD.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of the Borough Council of Wellingborough he proposes to make an Order under section 249 of the above Act, to provide for the extinguishment of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on a length of highway at Pebble Lane, Wellingborough, Northamptonshire, from its junction with Market Street, in a northwesterly direction for a maximum distance of 49 metres.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of that highway by vehicles being used:

(a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;

- (b) in connection with the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal in or near the said length of highway of any sewer, main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (c) in connection with maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of Pebble Lane and with building operations
