## Wimbledon area parking restrictions

Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Merton, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2. The general effect of the Order will be further to amend the Merton (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977, so that the following parking restrictions will apply:

(a) no waiting at any time:

(i) Palmerston Grove, the north side, from a point opposite the common party wall of Nos. 5-6 Palmerston Grove eastwards to the end of the cul-de-sac;

(ii) Palmerston Grove, the south side, from a point opposite the common party wall of Nos. 7-8 Palmerston Grove eastwards to the end of the cul-de-sac;

(iii) Southey Road, the west side, from a point 18-29 metres south of the southern kerb-line of The Broadway, to a point on The Broadway 18-29 metres west of the western kerb-line of Southey Road;

(iv) Southey Road, the east side, from a point 18-29 metres south of the southern kerb-line of The Broadway to a point on The Broadway 18-29 metres east of the eastern kerb-line of

Southey Road.

(b) no waiting or loading at any time:

(i) Griffiths Road, between a point opposite the north-eastern most wall of No. 55 Griffiths Road and a point 10 metres west of the south-western kerb-line of Southey Road;

(ii)) Montague Road, between a point 14 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Griffiths Road and a point 14 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Griffiths Road;

(iii) Pelham Road, between a point 15 metres north-west of the north-eastern kerb-line of Montague Road and the common

boundary of Nos. 59-61 Pelham Road;

(iv) Pelham Road, between a point 18-29 metres north-east of the north-east kerb-line of Southey Road and a point 15 metres south-west of the south-western kerb-line of Southey Road;

(v) Southey Road, the north-east side, between a point 14 metres north of the north-western kerb-line of Griffiths Road and a point 18-29 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerbline of Pelham Road;

(vi) Southey Road, the north-east side, between a point 15 metres west of the north-western kerb-line of Pelham Road and a point 18:29 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerbline of Pelham Road:

(vii) Southey Road, between a point 14 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Griffiths Road and a point 18-29 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Griffiths Road.

(c) no waiting between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., Monday to Saturday:

(i) Cross Road, entire road;(ii) Derby Road, entire road;

(iii) Harcourt Road, entire road;

(iv) Gladstone Road, between its junction with The Broadway and a point opposite the north-western boundary of No. 84 Gladstone Road;

(v) Granville Road, entire road;

(vi) Griffiths Road, excepting the lengths defined in subparagraph (b) above, the entire road;

(vii) Montague Road, between its junction with Kingston Road and a point 12-19 metres north-west of a point opposite the south-eastern wall of Nos. 51 to 55 Kingston Road

(viii) Palmerston Grove, excepting the lengths defined in sub-

paragraph (a) above, the entire road;

(ix) Palmerston Road, between its junction with Kingston Road and a point 18-29 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-lines of Harcourt Road and Palmerston Grove;

(x) Pelham Road, between its junction with Gladstone Road and a point 15-24 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-

line of Palmerston Road;

(xi) Russell Road, between its junction with The Broadway and a point opposite the north-western boundary of No. 83 Russell Road;

(xii) Southey Road, between the south-eastern kerb-line of The Broadway and a point 27-43 metres south-east of that

Note, those parking restrictions will revoke/amend the existing restrictions if implemented.

- 3. Exemptions are provided in the Order to permit vehicles to wait:
  - (a) to enable passengers to board or alight and to load or unload their personal luggage;

(b) for up to 20 minutes for the purpose of delivering and collecting goods or loading/unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the street;

(c) if they are being used to maintain the road or the services therein or by local authorities or the Post Office in pursuance to sttutory powers and duties.

Note, these exemptions will not apply to the proposed loading restriction in sub-paragraph 2(c) above.
