- (v) to introduce limited waiting of 1 hour, Monday to Saturday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., return prohibited within 2 hours on a certain length of Abbey Street.

The Order will contain exemptions which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading personal luggage, the maintenance of the roads, works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity and water and under the Telecommunications Act 1984, and for building or demolition works and for vehicles used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, vehicles while waiting upon any duly authorised parking place, hackney carriages while waiting upon any duly authorised cab rank, vehicles when used by medical practitioners in emergencies, vehicles when used by the Post Office for the purpose of collecting and delivering letters and postal packets to any post office situated in the testricted road and vehicles used in connection with weddings and funerals.
