

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable Medical Practitioners and Veterinary Surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the sides of length of road; the maintenance of essential services; weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled person's vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 3 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the proposed Order, a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, and a map showing the sides of length of road to which the proposed Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Cynon Valley Borough Council, Rock Grounds, High Street, Aberdare, and at the Mid Glamorgan County Hall, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours.

Side of length of road in the borough of Cynon Valley

(ii) The north-eastern side of Wind Street, Aberdare, from a point 45 metres (49 yards) north-west of the north-western side of its junction with Bethuel Street, and contiguous with (i) above, north-westwards for a distance of 10 metres (11 yards).

The County Council of South Glamorgan (Croescadarn Road, Pentwyn, Cardiff (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that on 27th February 1996 the County Council of South Glamorgan in exercise of its powers under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, made an Order the general effect of which is less restrictive than that originally advertised in *The London Gazette* on 28th October 1994 (issue No. 53833, reference No. 530) due to objections and will prevent you from driving any motor vehicle from proceeding along:

Croescadarn Road, Pentwyn, Cardiff, from a point 360 metres south of its junction with St. Mellons Road, for a distance of 360 metres south.

The Order will come into operation on 29th February 1996 or on the date the necessary lines and signs are placed on site, whichever is the later.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any provisions contained therein on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or that any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within 6 weeks from the date of this notice, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Gloucestershire County Council (A417 Ampney Crucis to Poulton) (30 m.p.h. and 50 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1996

Notice, is hereby given that on 20th February 1996 the Gloucestershire County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to:

1. prohibit the driving of any vehicle at speed exceeding 50 m.p.h. on that length of road number A417 Cirencester to Lechlade Road which extends from a point 1,000 metres west of the Ampney Crucis to Harnhill Road to a point 480 metres west of road number 3/152 Cricklade Road, Poulton.
2. (i) prohibit the driving of any vehicle on those lengths of the following roads at a speed exceeding 30 m.p.h. A417 Cirencester to Lechlade Road which extends from a point 480 metres west of road number 3/152 (known locally as Cricklade Street) to a point 130 metres south-east of road number 3/152 (known locally as Bell Lane); road number 3/152 (known locally as Bell Lane which extends from its junction with the A417 Cirencester to Lechlade Road for a distance of 410 metres in a northerly direction; road number 3/152 (known locally as Cricklade Street) which extends from its junction with the A417 Cirencester to Lechlade Road for a distance of 387 metres in a generally southerly direction and;
(ii) the whole lengths of road known as Elf Meadow, Westview, North View and Stony Pool.

Gloucestershire County Council (A435 Colesbourne) (50 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1996
