Ratisbon, May 14. We have Letters from the Fron-tiers of Hungary, which fay that General Loffelholtz, Governour of Peterwaradin, had Orders from the Imperial Court, that if the Courier lately. fent to Conftantinople with the Emperour's last Offer of his Mediation, between the Port and the Venetians, fhould not come back to Peterwaradin by the 15th Instant at Midnight, he should then immediately dis-patch an Express to Vienna, and the next Day fend to Belgrade to declare War against the Port, as would afterwards be done at Vienna. He had also Orders to stop any Turkish Boats which should be fent up the River Save with Ammunition. But as these Di-pension ware given harmonic But as these Directions were given before an Express from Sir Ro-bert Sutton (the British Ambalfadour at the Port) ar-rived at Vienna, 'tis likely they may have been changed, or at least delayed, on the Notice received by that Express of the Dispositions of the Turkish Court to accept the King of Great Britain's Media-tion between them and the Venetians.
