The Stopping Up of Highways (Tafolwern, Llanbrynmair, Powys) Order 199

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 248 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, to authorise the stopping-up of the sections of highway described in Schedule 1 to this notice.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in Schedule 2 to this notice to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Mr. G. A. Williams by Montgomeryshire District Council on 14th August 1995, under reference M25582.

The proposed Order requires the provision of new highway which will be highway maintainable at public expense, for which Powys

County Council shall be the Highway Authority.

SCHEDULE 1

(All measurements are approximate)

The sections of highways to be stopped up are at Tafolwern, Llanbrynmair in the County of Powys. They are shown by diagonal hatching on the annexed plan and include both carriageway and adjacent verge areas of Class 3 County Highway No. C2175 known as Tafolwern Road comprising:

(i) that length of highway (marked A) with a maximum width of 8-8 metres which extends from its junction with the A470 trunk road in a westerly direction for a distance of 27 metres; and

(ii) an irregular shaped area of highway (marked B) which extends from a point 40 metres south of the south-eastern corner of the property known as Brynolwern in a southerly direction for a distance of 21 metres and has a maximum width of 8.6 metres and an area of 232 square metres.

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 29

Notice is hereby given that on 1st March 1996, the Secretary of State for the Environment acting under section 29 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, made the Syresham Marshy Meadows (Northamptonshire) Nature Conservation Order 1996, applying section 29(3) of the Act to the land described in Schedule I to the Order and specifying the operations described in Schedule 2 to the Order which appear to the Secretary of State likely to destroy or damage the rich fen meadow and associated flora by reason of which the site is of special interest and of national importance. The Order is reproduced in the annex to this notice.

The general effect of the Order is to prohibit any person from carrying out the operations specified in Schedule 2 to the Order on the land described in Schedule 1. In certain circumstances this prohibition does not apply. These circumstances are set out in

section 29 of the Act.

The Order took effect when it was made and will cease to have effect 9 months after it was made unless the Secretary of State previously gives notice that he has considered it and does not propose to amend or revoke it or that he has amended or revoked it.

Representations about or objections to the Order may be made to the Secretary of State for the Environment, EWD4 Division, Tollgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol BS2 9DJ, before 12th April 1996. They should be in writing and should state the title of the Order, In the case of objections, the grounds on which they are made should be stated.

Copies of the Order and the map referred to in it have been deposited at the offices of the South Northamptonshire District Council, Planning Department, Springfields, Towcester, Northamptonshire NN12 7AY. They may be seen, free of charge, at all reasonable hours.

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 29

Syresham Marshy Meadows (Northamptonshire) Nature Conservation Order 1996

Whereas the land which is hereinafter described in the opinion of the Secretary of State for the Environment of special interest and of national importance by reason of it being an area of rich fen meadow with its associated flora and fauna.

And whereas it appears to the Secretary of State expedient to apply section 29(3) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to the said land for the purpose of conserving the rich fen meadow with its associated flora and fauna.

And whereas the Secretary of State has consulted the Nature Conservancy Council for England.

Now therefore the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 29(1) and (3) of the said Act of 1981 hereby orders as follows:

1. section 29(3) of the said Act of 1981 shall apply to the land described in Schedule I hereto and shown hatched and edged black on the map contained herein.

The operations specified in Schedule 2 hereto appear to the Secretary of State to be likely to destroy the rich fen meadow and associated flora and fauna.

This Order may be cited as the Syresham Marshy Meadows (Northamptonshire) Nature Conservation Order 1996.

Description of Land

All that area shown hatched and edged black on the map annexed hereto and situated within the Syresham Marshy Meadows Site of Special Scientific Interest, in the area of the South Northamptonshire District Council in the county Northamptonshire.

SCHEDULE 2

Specified Operations

Cultivation, including ploughing, rotovating, harrowing and reseeding.

Stock feeding.

Application of manure, fertilisers and lime.

Application of pesticides, including herbicides (weedkillers).
