Rome, May 2.

ON the 26th of last Month, a great Number of Persons of Quality, and of the Populace, went out of the Gate of the City called Porta Pia, to see a Race run by Barbs, as is usual at this Season annually. The Electoral Prince of Bavaria was invited on this Occasion, and saw the Race from the Villa Bolognetti. The Marquis de Gabrieli's Barb won the Prize, and immediately the Marquis offered to make a Present of him to his Electoral Highness; who excused himself from accepting it, but gave a Purse of Money to the Groom. His Electoral Highness having since taken Leave of the Pope, is gone on to Naples. Cardinal Schrottenbach, attended by many Coaches of the Foreign Ministers, and by all the German Gentry in this City, has notified to the Pope the Birth of the Archduke. The Ambassadour of Portugal has had an Audience of the Pope, relating to the Succours promised against the Infidels. Cardinal Imperiale is gone to Civita Vecchia, to give Orders for the greater Security of that Place.

Venice, May 8. On the 3d Instant Count Coleredo had *Te Deum* sung for the Birth of the Archduke; but not having made his Entry, did not appear in publick himself. After Mass, his Excellency gave a magnificent Dinner to Count Taxis, and all of the German Nation who are here; and at Night had Musick in his Palace. On the 4th, Sig. Francesco Quirini made his Entry as Procurator of St. Mark; and on the 5th his Brother made his Entry likewise for the same Dignity. 'Tis advised from Corfu, That some of our Gallies are gone to Zant; and that 12 Men of War are to follow them soon, for the Security of that Island. Twenty four Engineers are expected from Germany,

who were taken into the Service of this Republick by General Schulembourg. Sig. Battista Vitturi has fought a Galley of Dalcigno, and sunk her; but his own Vessel being much shatter'd, he has put into Port to refit.

Ratisbon, May 18. Letters from Vienna say, the Imperial Court still expect the Return of the Courier sent to Constantinople, before they take a final Determination touching the War with the Turks: In the mean Time Prince Eugene hastens his Field-Equipage. 'Tis advised from the Frontiers of Hungary, That part of the Imperial Troops are already in the Camps marked out for them; but that the Spring being backward, the Horse suffer for Want of dry Forrage. Lieutenant-General Roth has written a Letter to the Dyer, dated the 11th Instant, in which he represents a-new the Necessity of a Sum of Money being speedily advanced for Repairing the Works of Fort Kehl, part of which have suffered lately by the Violence of the Waters of the Rhine.

Copenhagen, May 19. The Squadron of Men of War commanded by Rear-Admiral Kaas continues at Elsinore. Several Men of War are fitting out in this Port with all Diligence, and will be ready in a few Days. The Swedish Fleet which had lain for some Days past between Dornbusch and Meunen, is now between Ystedt and Bornholm. We have Letters from Norway of the 9th and 11th Instant, which confirm that the Swedish Army has retired to the Frontiers of Sweden, without any considerable Loss.

Hambourg, May 22. Letters from Stetin of the 18th Instant give an Account, that on the 15th in the Morning the Czar arrived there with his Court, accompanied by several Foreign Ministers, and was received and entertained suitably to his Quality, by Major General Borek, who commands
