

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highways (County of West Yorkshire) (Leeds No. 1) Order 1996" authorising the stopping-up of Lytton Street and Cariss Street, Leeds.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

Part Hartopp/Part Raymond Road, Ward End, Birmingham

The M23 Motorway (Balcombe Road Interchange) Connecting Roads Scheme 199

The M23 Motorway (Balcombe Road Interchange) (Side Roads) Order 199

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Scheme and Order:

1. A Scheme under sections 16, 17 and 19 of the Highways Act 1980, which will:

- (1) authorise him to provide for the exclusive use of traffic of Classes I and II of the classes of traffic set out in Schedule 4 to the Highways Act 1980, two special roads to connect the M23

Motorway with Balcombe Road (B2036) at Crawley in West Sussex; and

- (2) provide for each of the new special roads to become a trunk road on the date when the Scheme comes into force.

2. An Order under sections 18 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, in relation to the M23 Motorway in the county of West Sussex, which will:

- (1) authorise him to:
 - (a) improve a length of Balcome Road and a length of Public Footpath No. 83,
 - (b) stop up a length of Public Footpath No. 83,
 - (c) construct a new footpath,
 - (d) stop up private means of access to premises, and
 - (e) provide new means of access to premises, all at Crawley, West Sussex; and

- (2) provide for the transfer of the new footpath to the West Sussex County Council as highway authority as from the date on which he notifies them that it has been completed and is open for use.

Copies of the draft Scheme and Order and the plans referred to in them, and of the Environmental Statement which the Secretary of State has published in relation to the construction of the new special roads referred to in the draft Scheme, may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours from 27th March 1996 until 22nd May 1996, or within 6 weeks from the date of first publication of this notice if that period expires later, at the Highways Agency, Room 12/08, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London SE1 0TE; and at the Highways Agency's Southern Network Management Division, Federated House, London Road, Dorking, Surrey RH4 1SZ; at the offices of West Sussex County Council, County Hall, Chichester, West Sussex PO19 1RL; at Crawley Borough Council, Town Hall, The Boulevard, Crawley, West Sussex RH10 1UZ; at Mid Sussex District Council, "Oaklands", Oaklands Road, Haywards Heath, West Sussex RH16 1SS, and at Crawley Central Library, County Buildings, Northgate Avenue, Crawley, West Sussex RH10 1XG.

Any person may object to the making of either the Scheme or Order not later than 22nd May 1996, or within 8 weeks from the date of publication of this notice if that period expires later, by notice to the Secretary of State at the office of the Director, Highways Agency, Southern Network Management Division, Federated House, London Road, Dorking, Surrey RH4 1SZ, quoting reference MSE/0/M23/0/65/1/4, and stating the grounds of objection.
