Which Address His Majefly was pleased to receive very gracioully.

Ratisbon, May 21. Letters of the 10th In-ftant from Segedin relate, that the Baffa of Temefwaer had fent 1000 Peafants to Vipallanka on the Danube, to draw up 800 Boats laden with all Sorts of warlike Stores to Belgrade, where 5 Boats had already arrived; they are accompanied by 25 Saicks and 8 Frigates. Several hundred Peafants were alfo ordered to cleanse the Ditches of Temeswaer, and the Paffage of the little River which furnishes them with Water. The Gar-rison there was only 1000 Foot and 400 Horfe, but a Baffa with 4000 Men more was expected; and 8000 were actually ordered to reinforce that of Belgrade, where the Bridge over the River Save was also ready; but in the mean Time all was quiet on the Fron-tiers. 'Some Tartars had been privately to view the Ways and Paffes from Campolongo in Walachia to Tranfylvania.

Dantzick, May 20. Forty eight of the Czar's, Gallies, with a Number of good Troops on board, continue still in our River. By an Express arrived this Merning from Warlaw we are inform d that the Chiefs of the Confe-derated Poles hav co f te a Cong els schall forthwith be h id t in , instead of , inflead of Jaroflaw, and they have alt yet 4 C 8 for Deputies, on the part of the K g, to r pair thither: The Bifh op of Cujavia is already gone for Warfaw, and Count Flemming will now follow very foon. 'Tis faid the King of Poland defigns to go from hence on the 22d for Elbing. The Articles of Agreement between the Czar, and this City of Dantzick, are in Subfance as follows. 1. During the prefent War, the City shall forbear all Commerce or Correspondence by Letters, with Sweden; and his Czarish Majesty may appoint an Agent to reside at Dantzick, who, upon Complaint to the King of Poland's Refident in the faid City, of any Proceedings contrary to this Agreement, Ihall have the Affiftance of the Magistrates for remedying fuch Abuse. 2. Four Privateers (carrying at least 12 Guns each) shall be furnished at the Expence of this City, to act against Sweden ; which Ships shall have the Commission, and carry the Colours, of the King of Poland; and as often as Neceffity shall require, these Ships shall put into any Harbour belonging to any of the Nor-thern Allies, and have Freedom and Protection there. 3. The faid Privateers shall be manned by Mariners, or others, in the King of Poland's Pay; and if his Polish Majesty think fit to admit any Mariners, or others, of his Czarish Majesty's Subjects to 'ferve on board these Ships, they shall take an Oath of Fidelity to the King of Poland, that they may be deemed to be in his Polish Majesty's Service. 4. If his Czarish Majesty shall have Occasion to fend by Sea to Copenhagen, Provisions or any thing elfe for the Use of his Forces, the City will, at their own Expense furnither Track

ports (called Fly-Boats,) or other Veffels fit for fuch Service; on condition that if thole Transports happen to be loft, or receive any Damage, his Czarish Majesty shall take it upon his own Account, and make good the fame to the Proprietors of those Veffels.

Copenhagen, May 23. Upon the Swedifh Fleet's returing behind Bornholm, the reinforcing of Vice-Admiral Gabel's Squadron with that commanded by Rear Admiral Kaas being judged unneceffary, the latter returned hither Yefferday at Noon from the Sound. A good Number of Workmen are employed here in fitting out feveral Men of War, to the End that when Vice Admiral Gabel comes back from Norway, we may have a Fleet of at least 20 Ships of the Line. There are in this Port above 20 English Merchant ships bound fome for Stockholm, and others for other Places in the Baltick, whither they will proceed the first fair Wind.

Hambourg, May 26. We have Letters of the 17th Inftant from Christiania in Norway, which give an Account, that the King of Śweden, with his Army, had retired over Onstalund, tho' General Lutzau had divided the Danish Forces into three Bodies, in order to hinder the Retreat of the Swedes, who, before the Danes could overtake them, were reinforced by 1800 Horle. The Czar arrived at Swerin on the 22d Inflant, The King of Denmark is expected to Night at Altena, from whence 'tis faid he will proceed to Lunebourg, and there have an Interview with the Czar.

Bruffels, Mry 30. On the 27th Inftant Mef-fieurs Vander Meersche, and Trieft d'Augein, two of the Deputies of f'landers to his Imperial and Catholick Majefty, arrived incognito in this Town, whence they let out the next Morning for Ghent; the other Deputies of Flanders and Brabant are not yet returned from Vienna, but are daily expected. General Court de Vehlen went hence two Days ago for Duffeldorp, where he defigns to wait the Marquis de Prie's Arrival in his Paffage to Holland ; who, 'tis faid, will set out the Sih of next Month, N. S. from Vienna. Count Kinigfeg. is gone this Morning, with his La-dy, for Namur, where they intend to pais the Whitfon-Holidays. The Countels of Egmont, who has been for fome Days indifpofed, is now fo ill that her Life is despaired Last Thursday the Earl of Arundel arriof. ved here from Paris.
