The Greenwich (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 15) Experimental Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Greenwich, hereinafter called the Council, on 15th April 1996, made the above-mentioned Orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

The general effect of the:

(a) Prescribed Route Order will be to prohibit all goods vehicles the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes from entering Romney Road;

(b) Waiting and Loading Restriction Order will be to amend the Greenwich (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1994, so as to prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time in the lengths of streets specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The prohibition mentioned in:

(a) paragraph 2(a) will not apply:

- (ii) in relation to a vehicle being used in connection with the removal of any obstruction in Romney Road; or
- (iii) in relation to a vehicle being used in connection with the cleansing of gullies in Romney Road, or being used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation in Romney Road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway in Romney Road, the laying, erection, alteration or repair in Romney Road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supplying of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunication system, or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to enter Romney Road; or

(b) paragraphs 2(a) and (b) will not apply:

- (i) in relation to any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes; or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
- (iii) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

Details of exemptions from the restrictions mentioned in paragraph 2(b) above, for certain vehicles and persons, together with restrictions on selling or advertising in a restricted street are contained in the original Order of 1994.

The Orders provide that in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Director of Development for the time being or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may, if it appears to him or that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs, modify or suspend these Orders or any provisions thereof.
