

Exemptions will be made in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein. Exceptions are also provided for emergency services vehicles, or for a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable or traffic warden in uniform. No exceptions will be provided for disabled persons' badgeholders.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the location of the road and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at The Deane House, Belvedere Road, Taunton, during normal office hours.

NEW ROADS AND STREET WORKS ACT

DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

NEW ROADS AND STREET WORKS ACT 1991, SECTION 58

Notice of substantial road works

Three month's advance notice is hereby given that Derbyshire County Council as Highway Authority intends to carry out substantial works for road purposes.

2. The streets in which these works will take place are:

- (a) Haddon Road (A6), Bakewell.
- (b) Buxton Road (A6), Ashford In The Water.
- (c) King Street (A61), Alfreton.

3. Works are expected to affect the:

- (a) carriageway between: SK 229 665 and SK 228 670.
- (b) carriageway between: SK 171 705 and SK 179 699.
- (c) carriageway between the junction of Gooker Lane and High Street.

4. Works are expected to commence on 2nd September 1996.

5. The works notified will include the following:

- (a) Plane off 40 millimetres deep in channels and HRA overlay to carriageway.
- (b) HRA overlay to existing carriageway.
- (c) Plane carriageway 40 millimetres deep and overlay with HRA.

6. Subject to the exemptions in the Act and Regulations under it, no street works may be executed for a period of 12 months from the completion of the works described in paragraph 5 without the consent of the said Highway Authority, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
