DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981—SECTION 29

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd May 1996 the Secretary of State for the Environment acting under section 29 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, made the Milborne Wick (Somerset) Nature Conservation Order 1996 applying section 29(3) of the Act to the land described in Schedule 1 to the Order and specifying the operations described in Schedule 2 to the Order which appear to the Secretary of State likely to destroy or damage the geological features including fossiliferous limestones by reason of which the site is of special interest and of national importance. The Order is reproduced in the annex to this notice.

The general effect of the Order is to prohibit any person from carrying out the operations specified in Schedule 2 to the Order on the land described in Schedule 1. In certain circumstances this prohibition does not apply. These circumstances are set out in section 29 of the Act.

The Order took effect when it was made and will cease to have effect 9 months after it was made unless the Secretary of State previously gives notice that he has considered it and does not propose to amend or revoke it or that he has amended or revoked it.

Representations about or objections to the Order may be made to the Secretary of State for the Environment, EWD4, Room 922, Tollgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol BS2 9DJ, before 12th July 1996. They should be in writing and should state the title of the Order. In the case of objections, the grounds on which they are made should be stated.

Copies of the Order and the map referred to in it have been deposited at the offices of the South Somerset District Council, Brympton Way, Yeovil. They may be seen, free of charge, at all reasonable hours.

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981—SECTION 29 NATURE CONSERVATION ORDER 1996

Whereas the land which is hereinafter described is in the opinion of the Secretary of State for the Environment of special interest and of national importance by reason of its geological features including fossiliferous limestones belonging to the Inferior Oolite of Middle Jurassic age.

And whereas it appears to the Secretary of State expedient to apply section 29(3) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to the said land for the purpose of conserving those geological features including the fossiliferous limestones.

And whereas the Secretary of State has consulted the Nature Conservancy Council for England.

Now therefore the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 29(1) and (3) of the said Act of 1981, hereby orders as follows:

1. section 29(3) of the said Act of 1981 shall apply to the land described in Schedule 1 hereto and shown edged black on the map contained herein;
2. the operations specified in Schedule 2 hereto appear to the Secretary of State to be likely to threaten the scientific integrity of the site.

This Order may be cited as the Milborne Wick (Somerset) Nature Conservation Order 1996.

SCHEDULE 1

Description of Land

All that area shown edged black on the map annexed hereto in the area of the South Somerset District Council in the county of Somerset.

SCHEDULE 2

Specified Operations

Dumping, spreading or discharge of any materials.
Extraction of minerals, including topsoil, subsoil, lime and spoil.
Construction, removal or destruction of roads, tracks, walls, fences, hard-stands, banks, ditches or other earthworks, or the laying, maintenance or removal of pipelines and cables.
Erection of permanent or temporary structures, or the undertaking of engineering works.
Storage of materials against any rock outcrop.
Battering, buttressing, grading or seeding any rock outcrop.
Removal of geological specimens, including fossils.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (County of Tyne and Wear) (No. 10) Order 1996" authorising the stopping up of highway at or in the vicinity of Coronation Street, St. Patricks Garth, Cork Street, Walton Garth and Walton Lane at East End, Sunderland in the county of Tyne and Wear. The stopping up is authorised to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Architectural Services, North Housing Association by the Council of the City of Sunderland, on 2nd November 1994, under Ref. 94/0812.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 7th June 1996, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of the Wealden District Council, he proposes to make an Order under section 249 of the above Act to provide for the extinguishing of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on part of Peelings Lane, Stone Cross, Westham in the county of East Sussex.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of that highway by vehicles being used:

- (a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- (b) in connection with the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal in or near the said length of highway of any sewer, main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (c) where the vehicle is a pedal cycle.
