#### **TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990**

The Stopping-up of Highways (Beggars Pound, Cowbridge Road, St. Athan, Vale of Glamorgan) Order 1996

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 247 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to authorise the stopping-up of the sections of highway described in the Schedule to this notice.

The stopping-up is authorised only in order to enable development consisting of the construction of six dwellings on land adjacent to Beggars Pound to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted by Vale of Glamorgan Borough Council on 28th September 1993 under ref. 93/00670/FUL. The Order shall cease to have effect upon the cessation of this planning permission.

The Order requires the provision of new highway which will be highway maintainable at public expense, for which Vale of Glamorgan Council shall be the Highway Authority.

Copies of the made Order and the annexed plan may be inspected during normal opening hours (9 a.m. to 1 p.m., 2 p.m. to 5.30 p.m., Mondays, Tuesday, Thursdays and Fridays, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Wednesdays, and 9 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays) at St. Athan Post Office, Rock Road, St. Athan, or may be obtained free of charge from the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Administration Division, Phase 1, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting ref. ZC 510-5-5-51).

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provisions contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act,

he may, within 6 weeks of 20th June 1996, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

#### SCHEDULE

(All measurements are approximate)

The sections of highway to be stopped up are at Beggars Pound, St. Athan in the county of the Vale of Glamorgan. They are shown by diagonal hatching on the annexed plan, are situated immediately east of the carriageway of Cowbridge Road and comprise:

- (i) an irregular shaped area of highway verge situated 15 metres south-west of the south-western corner of the property known as Coronation Cottage, having a maximum length of 12 metres. a maximum width of 8 metres and a total area of 50 square metres, and
- (ii) a strip of highway verge situated 1.5 metres south of (i) which extends in a southerly direction for a distance of 47 metres, has a maximum width of 4 metres and a total area of 155 square metres. (482)
