Vienna, June 17. The last Letters from the Frontiers of Turkey relate, that the Port had caufed M. Fleischman, the Emperor's Resident, to be put under Arrest. Twas designed to confine him in the Seven Towers, but the Ambassian of Great Britain and Holland having poterposed in his Behalf, and remonfirated against the treating of publick Mussfers in that Manner, 'twas resolved he should be kept Prifoier, and follow the Army. Yesterday this Court went into Mourning, for three Months, for the Death of the late Elector Palatine. The Day of Prince Eugene's Departure for the Army is not yet fixed.

gene's Departure for the Army is not yet fixed. Ratisbon, Fune 22. On the 19th Inflant, the Elector Palatine's Minisfler made and received the utual Proteilions and Compliments, on the Death of the late Elector John William, and the Succeffion of his late Elector John William, and the Succeffion of his prefent Electoral Highnet's Charles Philip , declaring, that he took Poffellion, in his Name, of the Rank, Seat, and Voice due to him in the Electoral College as Lord High Steward of the Empire. Advices from the Frontiers of Hungary, leave no room to doubt of a War with the Turks: Thofe of the 2d Infland from Peterwaradin fay, 'twas the general Difcourie in Seraglio and Bofnia; but the defigned Siege of Zadar was no more mentioned, and 'twas thought their Fleet (which is now under the Command of Kiuperli, as Seraskier) will be employed on fome other Enterprize, The Balfa of Bofnia had been ordered to raife 12000 Foot and 600 Horfe, which were almost compleat; and the Baffa of Marotch, with two others, weife come to Bagnia Luca, to command on thofe Frontiers. The Sultan and Grand Vizier arrived at Addianopleton the shift and will the Treops they can draw together on a fudden, are marching towards Belgrade, with the utmost Diligence, being apprehentive that the Imperialists may have a Defign againft that.Place. Several of the most confiderable Families; in Steraglio were retired from thence, and the Inhabitants on the Frontiers faved their Cattle and Effects in the Mountaint. 'Challul Baffa, Governor of Belgrade, had writ a Letter the 19th pafa, to the Gover. nor of Peterwaradin, acquainting him, that an Englifth Merchant, John Warren, was arrived there with his Recommendations and Convoy, and gone forward to Conftantinople, which he hoped would be taken for a Mark of Friendship, and the like continued on the fide of the Imperialist. Other Letters from Effeck of the 7th Instant, fay they had certain Information there, that the Port had received the Emperor's last Propositions in a very haughty Manner, and were refolved on the War. They add, that the Grand Vizier was expected at Belgrade in 10 or 42 Days with the main Army, and that 12000 Men were advancing before him.

Copenbagen, June 27. Our Advices from Norway fay, the Danish and Swedish Armies continue in their former Posts, without either of them undertaking any thing of Consequence. We have an Account that the Swedish Fleet, consisting of 16 Men of War of the Line, and fome Frigates, put to Sea from Carlfcrona on the 24th Instant. As for our Naval Forces, Vice-Admiral Gabel's Squadron constits of 7 Men of War, 3 others of our Men of War are lying off Meun, 8 are in this Port commanded by Rear-Admiral Kaas, and 4 more are fitting out here with all Expedition. The Czar is expected here in 8 or 10 Days. Sir John Norris with the Squadron of British Men of War under his Command, continues in the Sound.

Sir John Norris with the Squadron of Britih Mea of War under his Command, continues in the Sound-Bridlels, July 1. Count Kinigfegg, the Imperial Minifer, and M. Petters, who is charged with the Affairs of the States-General in thefe Provinces, have not yet adjufted the Difficulties ariter between the Imperial and Dutch Ingineers, about the Separation of the Limits in Flanders. Count Kinigfegg feems incluable to gain Time for the Deputies which the States of Flanaers delign to fend to the Hague, as the Arrival of the Marquis de Brie, to make the proper Repretentations on this Head. The general Alfembly of the States of Brabant which met on the 2,5th of June, to chufe a Deputy to the ordinary Affembly, in the Room of Count la Moterie, whole three Yaars will be expired the 1ft of October, put off the Election to the 24th of this Month, and went upon the Choice of Deputies to be fent to the Hague, on the Arrival of the Marquis de Prié, to reprefent the Grievances they pretend to lie under by the Barrier-Treary; and they chofe the three, who were at Vienna, viz. the Biflop of Antwerp, Count d' Urfel, and M. del Campo, Burgo-mafter of Antwerp; to whom they added M. Vander Brook, Greffier of the States of Brabant. The Province of Flanders will likewife fend Deputies on the fame Occafion ; they have not yet proceeded on the Nomination; but this thought they will make Choice of all, or tome of thoff who were deputed to Vienna. The Magiftrates of Ghent have fent one of their Echevins and a Secretary to the Court of France, to folice the Payment of the Debts due to that Town, and the Province of Flanders from the French King. The Marquis de Prié's Steward has taken the late Counteis of Egmon's Houfe, and another joining fo it, which are to be furnifhed againft the Arrival of that Minifter at this Place.
