ST. James's, June 25. The following Addresses have been presented to His Majesty.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the City of Gloucester. Presented to His Majesty by Nicholas Lechmere, Esq; their Recorder, introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Berkeley, their High Steward.

An humble Address of the Governor, Council, Assembly, Clergy, Officers Civil and Military, and other principal Inhabitants of the Bermudas, or Sommer Islands, in America, having been transmitted by Benjamin Bennet, Esq; Governor of Bermudas, has been presented to His Majesty by Sir John Bennet, Kt. introduced by the Right Honourable James Stanhope, Esq; One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

An humble Address of the Mayor, Magistrates, Gentlemen, Free-holders, and other the Inhabitants of the Borough of Petersfield in the County of Southampton. Presented to His Majesty by the Honourable Norton Powlter, Esq; one of the Representatives in Parliament for the said Borough, introduced by his Grace the Duke of Bolton, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household.

All which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Vienna, June 17. The last Letters from the Frontiers of Turkey relate, that the Port had caused M. Fleischman, the Emperor's Resident, to be put under Arrest. 'Twas designed to confine him in the Seven Towers, but the Ambassadors of Great Britain and Holland having interposed in his Behalf, and remonstrated against the treating of publick Ministers in that Manner, 'twas resolved he should be kept Prisoner, and follow the Army. Yesterday this Court went into Mourning, for three Months, for the Death of the late Elector Palatine. The Day of Prince Eugene's Departure for the Army is not yet fixed.

Ratisbon, June 22. On the 19th Instant, the Elector Palatine's Minister made and received the usual Professions and Compliments, on the Death of the late Elector John William, and the Succession of his present Electoral Highness Charles Philip; declaring, that he took Possession, in his Name, of the Rank, Seat, and Voice due to him in the Electoral College as Lord High Steward of the Empire. Advices from the Frontiers of Hungary, leave no room to doubt of a War with the Turks: Those of the 2d Instant from Peterwaradin say, 'twas the general Discourse in Seraglio and Bosnia; but the designed Siege of Zadar was no more mentioned, and 'twas thought their Fleet (which is now under the Command of Kuiperli, as Seraskier) will be employed on some other Enterprise. The Bassa of Bosnia had been ordered to raise 12000 Foot and 600 Horse, which were almost compleat; and the Bassa of Marosch, with two others, were come to Bagnia Luca, to command on those Frontiers. The Sultan and Grand Vizier arrived at Adrianople on the 9th past, and all the Troops they can draw together on a sudden, are marching towards Belgrade, with the utmost Diligence, being apprehensive that the Imperialists may have a Design against that Place. Several of the most considerable Families in Seraglio were retired from thence, and the Inhabitants on the Frontiers saved their Cattle and Effects in the Mountains. Challil Bassa, Governor of Belgrade, had writ a Letter the 25th past, to the Govern-

nor of Peterwaradin, acquainting him, that an English Merchant, John Warren, was arrived there with his Recommendations and Convoy, and gone forward to Constantinople, which he hoped would be taken for a Mark of Friendship, and the like continued on the side of the Imperialists. Other Letters from Esbeck of the 7th Instant, say they had certain Information there, that the Port had received the Emperor's last Propositions in a very haughty Manner, and were resolved on the War. They add, that the Grand Vizier was expected at Belgrade in 10 or 12 Days with the main Army, and that 12000 Men were advancing before him.

Copenhagen, June 27. Our Advices from Norway say, the Danish and Swedish Armies continue in their former Posts, without either of them undertaking any thing of Consequence. We have an Account that the Swedish Fleet, consisting of 16 Men of War of the Line, and some Frigates, put to Sea from Carlscrona on the 24th Instant. As for our Naval Force, Vice-Admiral Gabel's Squadron consists of 7 Men of War, 3 others of our Men of War are lying off Meun, 8 are in this Port commanded by Rear-Admiral Kaas, and 4 more are fitting out here with all Expedition. The Czar is expected here in 8 or 10 Days. Sir John Norris with the Squadron of British Men of War under his Command, continues in the Sound.

Brussels, July 1. Count Kingsegg, the Imperial Minister, and M. Pelters, who is charged with the Affairs of the States-General in these Provinces, have not yet adjusted the Difficulties arisen between the Imperial and Dutch Engineers, about the Separation of the Limits in Flanders. Count Kingsegg seems inclinable to gain Time for the Deputies which the States of Flanders design to send to the Hague, at the Arrival of the Marquis de Prié, to make the proper Representations on this Head. The general Assembly of the States of Brabant which met on the 25th of June, to chuse a Deputy to the ordinary Assembly, in the Room of Conit la Moterie, whose three Years will be expired the 1st of October, put off the Election to the 24th of this Month, and went upon the Choice of Deputies to be sent to the Hague, on the Arrival of the Marquis de Prié, to represent the Grievances they pretend to lie under by the Barrier-Treaty; and they chose the three, who were at Vienna, viz. the Bishop of Antwerp, Count d'Urzel, and M. del Campo, Burgo-master of Antwerp, to whom they added M. Vander Brook, Greffier of the States of Brabant. The Province of Flanders will likewise send Deputies on the same Occasion; they have not yet proceeded on the Nomination, but 'tis thought they will make Choice of all, or some of those who were deputed to Vienna. The Magistrates of Ghent have sent one of their Echevins and a Secretary to the Court of France, to solicit the Payment of the Debts due to that Town, and to the Province of Flanders from the French King. The Marquis de Prié's Steward has taken the late Countess of Egmont's House, and another joining to it, which are to be furnished against the Arrival of that Minister at this Place.
