#### Mersey Docks and Harbour Revision Order

Notice is hereby given that The Mersey Docks and Harbour Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") have applied to the Secretary of State for Transport to make a Harbour Revision Order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964.

The main object of the proposed Order is to authorise the construction of a new piled jetty and pontoon together with berthing dolphins adjoining Trafalgar Dock, Liverpool, and a bridge to the new jetty, part of a proposed new Roll-on Roll-off ferry terminal. #### Notice of application for a licence to abstract water

Take notice that M. N. Beckett, of Aldham Hall Farm, Aldham, Colchester, Essex CO6 3RW, is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to abstract water from the Roman River at National Grid Reference TL915245 at Aldham. The proposal is to abstract water at the rate of 115 cubic metres per hour, 1,380 cubic metres per day, 27,277 cubic metres per year between November and March each year. The water will be used for the irrigation of agricultural crops.

#### Notice of application for a licence to abstract water

Take notice that E. G. & J. E. & N. J. Bevan of Pollen Farm, Ullingswick, Hereford, is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to abstract water from an unnamed stream at National Grid Reference SO54815009 at Moor Court Farm, Bodenham, in the parish of Bodenham. The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 8 cubic metres per hour, 151 cubic metres per day, 22,727 cubic metres per year, between 31st October and 1st April each year. The water will be used for winter storage purposes for subsequent conservation and spray irrigation. No water will be abstracted from the stream during summer months.
