FORESTRY COMMISSION

The Forestry Commissioners hereby give notice that they have made Regulations under the European Communities Act 1972 entitled The Plant Health (Fees) (Forestry) (Great Britain) Regulations 1006

These Regulations, which apply to Great Britain, revoke and supersede the Import and Export (Plant Health Fees) (Forestry) (Great Britain) Order 1990 and the Import and Export (Plant health Fees) (Forestry) (Great Britain) (Amendment) Order 1991.

The Regulations prescribe the fees payable in respect of services provided by the Forestry Commissioners in connection with the giving, variation or suspension of authorities to issue plant passports under article 17 of the Plant Health (Forestry) (Great Britain) Order 1993 and in connection with licenses under articles 28 and 28A of that Order. These services are provided in accordance with the requirements of Council Directive 77/93/EEC on protective measures against the introduction into the Community of organisms harmful to plants or plant products and against their spread within the Community (OJ No. L26, 31.1.77, p.20), as amended, and Commission Directive 95/44/EEC establishing the conditions under which certain harmful organisms, plants, plant products and other objects listed in Annexes I to V to Council Directive 77/93/EEC may be introduced into or moved within the Community or certain protected Zones thereof, for trial or scientific purposes and for work on varietal selections (OJ No. L184, 3.8.95, p. 34).

The Regulations also revise the structure of the fees that were previously prescribed in respect of import and licensing services by the Import and Export (Plant Health Fees) (Foresty) (Great Britain) Order 1990.

The Regulations will come into operation on 1st October 1996 and have been published as Statutory Instrument No.2291.
