Notice of application for a licence to abstract water

Take notice that A. E. Griffiths, of Heath House Farm, Stanton-on-Hine-Heath, Shrewsbury SY4 4EU, is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to abstract water from the unnamed tributary of the Platt Brook between National Grid Reference SJ59312456 and SJ59242402 at Heath House Farm in the parish of Stanton-on-Hine-Heath and the district of North Shropshire.

The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 50 cubic metres per hour, 1,200 cubic metres per day and 35,000 cubic metres per year between November and March each year. The water will be used to fill a reservoir for subsequent spray irrigation.

A copy of the application and any map, plans and other documents submitted with it may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours between 26th September and 24th October 1996.

BLACKPOOL BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Blackpool (Various Roads) (Various Restrictions) and (Revocation) No.2 Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that on 19th September 1996, Blackpool Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with the Lancashire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers made the above Order.

The effect of the Order is as described in *The London Gazette*, of 8th July 1996, issue No. 54458, reference No. 483 as modified by the deletion of the proposed no waiting restrictions fronting properties 343-345 Whitegate Drive and the one-way traffic flow providing seasonal limited waiting on the south side of Vance Road.

A copy of the Order which will come into operation on 30th September 1996, and a map showing the roads affected may be inspected during normal office hours at the address below.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from the date of this notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.

BLACKPOOL BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Blackpool (Blenheim Avenue) (Residents' Parking Places) Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that Blackpool Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Lancashire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 1, 2, 4, 45, 46, 46A, 49, 53, 124(1)(c) and 124(1)(d) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, propose to make the above-mentioned Order.

The Order will have the following effects:

To designate the lengths of road specified in the first Schedule to this notice as residents and visitor parking places.

To prohibit waiting at any time on the lengths of road specified in the second Schedule to this notice.

(i) To enable residents in the respective roads specified in the third Schedule to this notice, who are owners of private motor vehicles, to purchase a residents' parking permit for the sum of £5 per year; and

(ii) to enable residents in the respective roads specified in the third Schedule to this notice to purchase a Visitors Parking permit in the sum of £5 per year.

(Households will be limited to one resident's and one visitor's parking permit).

Exemptions to the proposed No Waiting Order will permit vehicles to wait for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading and unloading vehicles;
- (c) emergency service vehicles;

and where necessary in connection with:

- (d) the maintenance of the roads or services therein;
- (e) building operations, or demolition;
- (f) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Full details of the draft Order, together with a map and a statement or reasons for making the Order, may be inspected during normal office hours at the Director of Technical Services Office, Town Hall, Blackpool.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order, you should send the grounds for your objection, in writing, to the undersigned by 15th October 1996.

CARDIFF COUNTY COUNCIL

The Council of the City and County of Cardiff (Waugron Road, Fiarwater) (Limited Waiting) Order

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City and County of Cardiff, in exercise of its powers under section 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other enabling powers proposes making the following Order, the general effect of which will be to prevent you from leaving your vehicle in Waugron Road on its south side, from a point 50 metres east of its junction with St. Fagans Road for a distance of 15 metres east.
