

GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*Gloucestershire County Council (Hatherop Road No 3/157)
(Coln St. Aldwyns) (30 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1996*

Notice is hereby given that on 24th September 1996 Gloucestershire County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of any vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 m.p.h. on that length road number 3/157 known as Hatherop Road, from a point 120 metres east of the junction with road number 3/166 (Road to Quenington) to a point 740 metres west of road number 3/159 at Glebe Farm, Hatherop in the Parish of Coln St. Aldwyns, within the Cotswold District, in the county of Gloucestershire.
