Just now Colonel Count Kevenhuller is arrived with the News, that on the 5th of this Month Prince Eugene attacked the Turkish Army, consisting of 230000 Men, encamped near Carlowitz, having the Danube on their Right, and the Save on their Left: That the Fight was very bloody, the Turks defending themselves well at the beginning, but being broken and put to the Rout, a dreadful Slaughter was made of them: That they were forced to abandon above 100 Pieces of Cannon in their Camp, with all their Tents and Baggage; and great Numbers who escaped the Sword of the Imperialists, were driven into the Save and Danube, where they perished; so that the Loss of the Turks was reckoned at above 100000 Men, the Imperialists having had full Time to pursue them after the Fight, which began very early in the Morning. We do not yet know exactly the Loss of the Imperialists, but 'tis said not to amount to 4000 Men, among whom are no Persons of Distinction, besides the Majors-Generals Count Guellen and M. Landtsen, and Lieutenant Colonel Count Palfi; Major General Count Preiner was found in the Grand Vizier's Tent, in Chains, and murdered with many Wounds. We expect every Moment another Courier with all the Particulars. Prince Eugene wrote in the Grand Vizier's Tent, the Letter notifying this Victory to the Emperour.
