TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

*The Stopping-up of Highways (County of Hertfordshire)
(No. 5) Order 1996*

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby give notice that, on the application of Robin Beacham, he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highways (County of Hertfordshire) (No. 5) Order 1996" authorising the stopping-up of part of Old Baldock Road, Buntingford, Hertfordshire, to enable development consisting of the reconstruction of stables and barn to provide four No. two-bed dwellings and erection of nine No. one and two-bed dwellings together with access, car parking and landscaping at the former How Green Farmhouse, Baldock Road, Buntingford, to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted under Part III of the Act to Robin Beacham, by East Hertfordshire District Council on 21st December 1995, under Ref. 3/94/1526/FP(15).

Lea Hall Road, Birmingham

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of a length of Lea Hall Road, Birmingham.
