Pieces of Cannon, and 6 Mortars, with all their Ammunition and Provisions, &c. 'Tis thought ftrange that the Turks not being pursued, should leave behind them all their Train of Artillery: The People take it for a Miracle wrought by St. Spi-ridion, Patron of the Town. 'Tis certain, that the Day of the last Affault the Turks loft 3000 Men, and 800 in the Sally on the 18th; that they loft great Numbers in other Actions; that there being alfo Diftempers among them, they had not above 15 or among them, they had not above 15 or 16080 Men left in a Condition to fight, and those were very much fatigued by the bad Weather, and disheartned by the Arrival of the 8 Spanish Men of War, taking likewise for an ill Omen the Accident which befell the Main-Maft of one of their Sultanas : Which, joyned to the great Valour of General Schu-lenbourg (who from the first Day of the Siege to the last, never failed to visit constantly all the Posts, to give his necessary Orders, and animate the Troops by his Presence and Example) fo much dispirited the Turks, that they chole rather to abandon their Train of Artillery, &c. than to be retarded in their Flight

by carrying it off with them. Rome, Sept. 7. Letters of the 28th of Au-gust from Corfu relate, that on the 21ft the Turks broke up the Siege of that Place in great Dilorder, after having killed feveral of their Officers who were against their re-treating; and made no halt till they arrived at Guino, where their Fleet lay. On the 22d and the three following Days they imbarked, and their Fleet failed away by the Coaft of Epirus, in good Order with a fair Wind, without being opposed. On the 27th the Venetian Fleet flood after them, as if they had refolved to give them chace; but came back to Corfu on the 28th.
