Notice of an application for consent to construct and operate a combined heat and power plant at Bridgewater Paper Company, Ellesmere Port, in the Borough of Ellesmere Port and Neston.

Notice is hereby given that PowerGen CHP Ltd has applied under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989, for the consent of the Secretary of Trade and Industry to construct and operate a Combined Heat and Power Plant at Bridgewater Paper Company, Ellesmere Port, in the Borough of Ellesmere Port and Neston. ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

LONDON BOROUGH OF CROYDON

The Croydon (Prohibition of Stopping Outside Schools) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1997 (Amendment No. 1) Traffic Order 1997

Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Croydon on 23rd May 1997, made the above mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 and Part IV to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order will be:

- (a) to prohibit waiting by vehicles during the hours between 8 a.m. to 9.30 a.m., and 2.30 p.m. to 4 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, during school term time on the mandatory "Keep Clear" markings outside the school entrance located on the south-east side of Cherry Orchard Road, East Croydon, at a point opposite the common boundary of Nos. 100 and 102 Cherry Orchard Road, and extending south-westward for a distance of 25.60 metres;
- (b) to provide that an officer authorised by the Council may issue a penalty charge notice where he has reason to believe that a vehicle is parked in contravention to the provisions of the Order; and
- (c) to invest officers of the Council with the power to immobilise or remove vehicles that may be parked on a mandatory School "Keep Clear" marking in a manner contravening the said provisions of the Order.

The prohibition and restriction referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform; or anything done in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on a highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.
