Staveley Conservation Area Extension No. 2

Notice is given under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act Section 69 that the Chesterfield Borough Council has determined that the area described in the Schedule to this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest the character of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and has therefore designated this area as a conservation area.

The effect of the designation of the conservation area is as follows:

1. Conservation area consent will now be required for the demolition of all unlisted buildings (other than excepted buildings) in the area;
2. Planning applications for development which would in the opinion of the local planning authority affect the character or appearance of the conservation area must be given publicity and representations received as a result of the publicity must be taken into account in determining the application;
3. It becomes an offence subject to certain exceptions to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in the area except with the consent of the local planning authority;
4. The local planning authority are now under a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the area.

Variation of Slinfold Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 section 69, Horsham District Council by resolution of its Planning and Development Committee dated 28th January 1997, has determined to vary the boundary to the Conservation Area of Slinfold. The area described in the Schedule no longer adds to the special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance, therefore the area is to be cancelled from the Conservation Area.

The effect of the variation to cancel part of the Conservation Area removes the following controls from that area:

- (a) Where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the Conservation Area is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Area, the application will be subject to the special

procedure in section 73 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (publicity for applications affecting Conservation Areas).

- (b) Anyone wishing to demolish a building or a part of a building within the Conservation area must, (subject to certain exemptions), first apply for consent from the Local Planning Authority.
- (c) Anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop or uproot, or wilfully damage or destroy any tree, within the Conservation area, must first give notice to the Local Planning Authority and may undertake the work only with the consent of the Local Planning Authority or after the expiry of a period of six weeks.

A map of the Conservation Area may be inspected, free of charge, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. to 5.20 p.m., Mondays to Thursdays, and 10 a.m. to 4.20 p.m. on Fridays, at the Directorate of Planning, Park North, North Street, Horsham.
