Copenhagen, November 7. N the 3d Inftant the King went from hence to Fredericksburg, and is thence gone to pafs fome Days at Walloe, fcven Leagues from this Place. 'Tis faid his Majefty will fhortly go to Hambourg, in order to proceed from thence to have an Interview with the King of Great Britain. The Britifh Squadron and Danifh Fleet are now at Bornholm : The Britifh and Dutch Merchant-Men are daily expected here, we having had Advice of their being come to Dantzick. A Battallion of the Regiment of Witfelt, which came hither from Norway fome Time ago, is ordered to be feat back thither; and a Train of Artillery is getting ready, to be feat, with other Troops, to that Kingdom, affoon as our Fleet returns to this Port. In the mean Time Ordez is already feat to the Squadron of three Men of War, 2 Prahmes, 4 Frigates, and fome Gallies, which have their Station on that Coaft, to keep a good Guard before Schwinfund.

Berlin, Nov. 7. Count Golofkin, the Czar's Minister at this Court, has received Letters from his Czarish Majefty dated the 31ft past from the Little Belt, whence his Majefty defigned to proceed to Lubeck, and flay there two or three Days. He was not arrived there on the 3d Inftant, when the laft Letters came away; but was fuddenly expected, the Gunners having been ordered to be ready on the Walls to fire the Cannon at his Entrance. The The Czar has declined coming to Oranienburg for the Interview with the King of Pruffia, and defires some other Place may be proposed nearer the Elbe, and not so far out of his Road to Holland, where he defigns to pass fome Part of the Winter, to inform himfelf about Gardening and Architecture, in which he begins to take very great Pleasure. Let-ters from Warsaw of the 30th of last Month, fay the Debates the Day before between the King's Plenipotentiaries and the Deputies of the Confederates, were carried to high, that both Parties retired' in a feeming Defpair, of the Negociation; but came to a batter Agreement in the Meeting on the 30th, and the Appearance of an intire Accommodation increated. Here are alfo Letters of the 2d Inflant from Warfaw, which tell us the whole Treaty was concluded, and was to be publifhed on the 7th; of which we wait the Confirmation. It is believed that General Bauer, with his Horfe, is already paft the Frontiers of Mecklenburg in his way to Poland, the Mulcovite and Pruffian Commiffaries having met at Schwedt on the 2d Inflant to regulate their March; and we are affured they will fhortly be followed by the greateft Part of the Foot.

Hague, Nov. 13. The 10th Inflant being the Birth-day of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, it was celebrated by the Lord Cadogan, His Britannick Majefty's Ambaffadour and Plenipotentiary to this State, with extraordinary Magnificence. His Lordship had, on this Occafion, the Ule of Prince Maurice's House belonging to the States, where he gave a Supper, and a Ball, yo which the Deputies of the States, all the foreign Ministers, and Perfons of Distinction here as well Foreigners as Natives, were invited; and above 700 Persons were at this Entertainment. Baron Heems has delivered to the States a Letter from His Imperial Majefty, notifying to them the taking of Temeswaer. On the 11th the Marquess de Prié having dispatched a Cou-rier to Vienna, set out from hence in the Evening for Rotterdam, in order to imbark there for Moredyke, thence to proceed to Bruffels.

Bruffels, Nov. 14. Yesterday the General of the Order of the Capuchins arrived here from Mons; the Secretary le Roy met him at the Hall Gate, and conducted him in one of Countr Kiniglegg's Coaches with fix Horles to the Court, where he was received by the Imperial Minister, with the ufual Ceremonies. This General, who is 80 Years of Age, made a short Speech in Latin; to which his Excellency returned an Answer in the same Language. He was afterwards conducted to the

the Capuchin Cloyftets, where he intends to lodge during his Stay in this Town. Count Kinigfegg, the Imperial Minister, ha-ving accepted, in the Emperour's Name, the Subfidy of one Million of Florins, lately granted by the Province of Flanders, and confirmed their Privileges, as it is cuftomary on the like Occafions, the States of that Province, who have been here for fome Days paft, returned this Morning to Ghent. The Marquis de Palliotti having fome Time fince put his Lieutenant Collonel, de Vigne, under Arreft at Mons, for fome Words that paft between them at Table, the Lieutenant Collonel, fup-pofing himfelf unjuftly confined, has de-manded a Court Martial, which Count Vehlen has granted him. And the Count has also appointed another Court Martial, of which Major General Chanclos is Prefident, to examine the Difference between Brigadier D'Audignies and his Major de Soizy; but the Court has refused to fit, before the Parties concerned shall have configned a certain Sum of Money, fufficient to defray the Charges of the Officers, who are to come to this Town from feveral Garrisons on that Occasion.
