The Borough of Stafford (Off-Street Parking Places) (Various Car Parks, Stone) Order 1997

Notice is hereby given that the Borough Council of Stafford, subject to the approval of Staffordshire County Council and the Chief Officer of Police, and in exercise of their powers under section 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, propose to make an Order to control the parking places named in the Schedule to this notice, which shows the class of vehicles, the days and times of operation, and the maximum period for waiting.

The Order will specify the conditions under which the parking places may be used. Full details are contained in the Draft Order which, together with maps showing the locations of the parking places and a copy of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at my office during normal working hours.

If anyone wishes to object to this Order, the objection, with the grounds for making it, should be made in writing to the undersigned not later than 3rd October 1997.
