HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Oxfordshire County Council (A4421: Buckingham Road to Eastern Perimeter Road Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1997

The Oxfordshire County Council hereby give notice that they have made, and submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, an Order under section 14 and section 125 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising the council to:

- (a) improve highways (including raising, lowering and otherwise altering);
- (b) stop up highways;
- (c) construct new highways;
- (d) stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) provide new means of access to premises;

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road known as the A4421 Buckingham Road to Eastern Perimeter Road Classified Road, which the council are proposing to construct and improve between a point on Skimmingdish Lane 243 metres east of the centre point of the roundabout at the junction of the A421, the B4100 and Skimmingdish Lane, and a point on the Eastern Perimeter Road 48 metres north of the centre of the railway track at the Eastern Perimeter Road Crossing.
