Berlin, Dec. 26. Two Posts of the 16th and 19th are just arrived from Warlaw; the first gave great Hopes that all would be finished the next Day, the Confederates, in Confideration of what they hourly fuffered under the Saxons and Muscovites, and of the Divisions amongst themselves, complying with whatever almost was proposed by the Court both in the Establishment and Payment of the Army; and the chief Points being ac tually drawn up into the Form of a Conftitution, ready to be paffed in one or two Sef-fions : But thole of the 19th talk again very doubtfully of the Success. Prince Wiesno-wieski and the Palatin of Lublin had been deputed by the Confederates to the Grand Generals of Poland and Lithuania, to defire they would take the Oathe prefcribed to them by the Treaty of Accommodation, and immediately re-affume their former Command of the Armies; but they have politively re-fuled the faid Oath, before it is moderated in feveral Points, particularly as to their Right of being present and voting at the Election of their Kings, which every private Nobleman has, as to their holding their own Courts of Justice, and as to their Prerogative of dif-pofing freely all Military Charges. Some were apt to fear this might give Occasion to new Disturbances, several of the Poles, particularly the Staroft of Bobruiski Sapieha, aiming at a Re-confederacy : The Marshals of the Confederacy delayed their coming on this Side of the Viftula from Time to Time.

Copenhagen, Dec. 29. On the 21st arrived an Express from Norway, with the welcome News that the Man of War and Transports, which in the Storm were feparated from Commadore Tordenschild, are arrived in Stavern and other Ports of that Kingdom. Thofe Transports which came back hither, will fail again for Norway the first fair Wind, in order to which the Troops re imbarked Yef-terday. The Dutch Fleet failed out of the Sound on the 22d.

Hague, Jan. 5. On the 2d Instant we had Advice, that the greatest Part of the Fleet which was expected from the Baltick had that Day entred the Texel, and 'tis not doubt. ed the reft are fince come in. The Czar continues at Amsterdam : His Confort is not yet arrived in this Country. The States of this Province re-affembled to Day, to confider of the Propositions made by the Council of State for regulating the State of the War fot the Year enfuing. Yesterday in the Af-ternoon, the Treaty of Defensive Alliance between Great-Britain, France, and this State, was figned by the Lotd Cadogan, Ambaffadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of His

Britannick Majefty, the Abbot du Bois and the Marquele de Chateauneuf the French Ambaffadours, and the Deputies of the Provinces of this Republick. Letters from Hanover of the 1st, fay the Earl of Sunderland defigned to be here by the 7th, and Mr. Secretary Stanhope by the 9th Inftant. We have also Advice, that Preparations were making for His Britannick Majefty's Departure from Hanover in a few Daye, in order to imbark at Helvoetfluys for England.
