The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majefty in His Privy-Council was this Day graciously pleased to declare the Right Honourable Charles Lord Viscount Townshend, Lord Lieutenant of His Majefty's Kingdom of Ireland. JA. VERNON.

An humble Address of the Bailiffs, Recorder, Gentlemen, Freemen, and other Inhabitants of the Town and Corporation of Kingston upon Thames, has been presented to His Majesty by the Honourable Thomas Onflow, Efq; intro-duced by the Right Honourable James Stanhope, Elq; one of His Majesty's Principal Se-cretaries of State.

An humble Address of the Governour, Council, Affembly, Clergy, Officers Civil and Military, and other principal Inhabitants of the Bermudas or Summer Islands in America, has been presented to His Majesty by Sir John Bennett, introduced by the Right Honourable James Stanhope, Esq; one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Genoa, Jan. 19. Letters from Leghorne advife, that the Fox, a British Man of War, was getting ready to put to Sea from thence for Great Britain. The Rochefter, another Man of War, is daily expected here from Leghorne, having on board the British Envoy Mr. Davenant's Lady and Family, which Minister has fixed his Refidence in this City for fome Time.

Venice, Jan. 22. 'Tis advised from Dalmatia, that Sig. Angelo Emo has reviewed all the Horfe and Foot, and that the Christians have had feveral Advantages lately over the Turks in those Parts. On the 17th Instant General Count Schulenbourg dined with Mr. Cunningham, Refident of the King of Great-Britain, and yesterday that Refident dined with his Excellency; which was by particular Per--million of the Inquisitors of State. They write from Otranto, that a Venetian Ship had taken in the Bay of Durazzo a Tartan belonging to Paleigno of 20 Guns and 190 Men, and car-Fied her to Corfu. On the 18th a Man being wonvicted here of Blasphemy, had his Tongue cut out, and was feat to the Gallies for five Years. Sig. Andrew Cornaro, Son of the late Proveditore-General of the Navy, is made Pro curator of St. Mark, on his advancing the usual Sum of 25000 Ducats. Our Naval Prepara-tions for carrying on the War against the Turks the enfoing Spring, are continued with great Diligence ; but this State does not think fit to make any Addition to their Land Forces employed last Year.

Days; the Paffports and other neceffary Difpatches from this Court being to be deli-

vered to him to Morrow. Stockholm, Dec. 18. The King of Sweden is still at Lund, continuing the Review of his Regiments of Horfe, and causes all such Horfes as are not of the Size or Colour which he thinks proper for the Service, to have one of their Ears cut off, and to be disposed of by publick Sale : 'Tis faid the Number of Horfes which have been already thus difmiffed amounts to about 5000. He has also published an Order forbidding, for the future, the receiving into his Regiments any other Horfes than what are black, brown or bay. 'Tis faid his Majefty will go next Week to Ystadt, and that he will stay there till the ufually coldeft Part of the Seafon is over. The last Letters from Schonen tell us, that three Regiments of Foot were marched from thence, taking their Route by Wennersbourg, which is the Way the King paffed when he entered Norway laft Year. The fame Letters fay, that his Majefty fpent fome Time daily in Conference with Count Vander Nath, for fettling the Taxes for the enfuing Year. On Sunday laft a Placart was published in all the Churches of this City, by which the new Me-thod of levying the Taxes which was introduced four Yeats ago, is abrogated, and the old one re-eftablished; but instead of five Crowns, which was the most that every whole Farm paid hitherto, they are now rated each at feven Crowns and an half; and all the Clergy are taxed treble the Sum they paid be-fore, though Merchants and Traders are only charged double. Our Advices from Gottenburg and that Neighbourhood give a parti-cular Account of the Lois of Iome Danish Transports which were driven on that Coast in a Storm the beginning of this Month: Two of those Ships having on board about 600 Men, were wrecked near Maelstrand, but the Men were all faved and fecured; ano-ther Vessel was funk and about 500 Men in t drowned; and others having on board Men, **Provisions** and Ammunition were taken by the Privateers of Gottenburg; but we have yet no exact Account what is the whole Number of Priloners, which by this Accident fell into the Hands of the Swedes. Last Week an English Ship from Dantzick was feized in this Port by the Owners of a Privateer which met her at Sea in her Paffage hither; the Captain of the Privateer, after having examined the Bills of Lading, and other Documents, let her proceed on her Voyage; but the Owners pre-tend however, that the ought to be made a Prize, and have applied to the Court of Admiralty to get her condemned, in which 'tis thought they will fueceed, though the greatest

part of her Cargo belongs to Swedes. Copenhagen, Jan. 30. The King of Den-mark has been indificient for fome Days, but is now on the Recovery. Direction is given for bringing hither all the Swedish Prifoners
