*St. James's, Feb. 11.*

**A**N humble Address of the Bishop and Clergy of the Diocess of St. Asaph, has been presented to His Majesty by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of St. Asaph, introduced by the Right Honourable James Stanhope, Esq; one of His Majesty's principal Secretaries of State.

*Dresden, Feb. 10.* By an Express from Warsaw we have received Advice, that on the 30th of last Month about eight a Clock at Night, the Ratifications of the Treaty of Pacification were exchanged; that the Day following a Dyet was assembled extraordinarily, as had been agreed by the Treaty, and all the Articles being read, the King and the States of the Republick gave their Approbation and Assent to them. Since which the Treaty has been begun to be put in Execution on the King's Part, the Saxon Troops being actually on the March to return to this Country, and an Order is dispatched to Kuningstein for setting at Liberty M. Jablonowski, Palatine of Ruffia, who has been a Prisoner there a long time. Some Letters tell us, that Prince Dolhoroucki had sent Order to the Ruffian Troops which were commanded by General Ronne lately deceased, to retire towards their own Country; but we do not learn that the like Order has yet been sent to the other Body of Ruffians commanded by General Bauer, now in Great Poland. In the Dyet above-mentioned, the King, as well as all the Members of the Dyet, took an Oath reciprocally to observe the Treaty inviolably: And the particular Dyets of every Palatinate will be speedily held, in order to the more thorough Settlement of the Peace of the Kingdom. All being now quiet, the King designs to make a Journey into this Country towards the End of this Month.

*Paris, Feb. 17. N. S.* The Court has received Advice from Avignon, that on the 6th Instant the Pretender left that Place, and on the 9th arrived at Romans in Dauphiné. He designed to be at Montmelian on the 14th, to stay there the 15th; and then to proceed to pass Mount Cenis. The King's Ratifications of the Treaty of Defensive Alliance, between Great Britain, France, and the States General of the United Netherlands, are sent to the Marquess de Chateauneuf Ambassadour at the Hague, in order to be exchanged.

*Whitehall, Feb. 11.* His Majesty has been graciously pleased to grant the Dignities of Baroness and Viscountess of Great Britain to Margaret the Daughter of the Right Honourable Thomas Lord Coningsby, by the Name Style and Title of Baroness of Hampton-Court in the County of Hereford, and Viscountess Coningsby of Hampton-Court in the said County. The Dignity of Baron and Viscount to descend to her Heirs Male.
