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Etters from Hermanstad in Transylvania of the upth past relate, that on the state and Party of Turks, confifting of 400 Foot, and a like Number of Horie, having advanced towards Krejova, took and car-ried off Prifoners what People they found in that Neighbourhood, together with a good Number of Cattle : But Lieutenant Collonel Dettine, with only three Troops of Imperia-lifts and fome Militia, going in Purfuit of them, overtook them as they were about to pass the Danube near Orfova, and after a very fharp Action, in which all the Turkifh Foot except 40 Men, and about 100 of their Horse were killed, recovered all the Prilo-ners and Booty: On this Occasion the Imperialists are said to have lost only a Captain, a Lieutenant, and about 30 Men. The Emperour had nomina-ted M. Cuvelier, Penfionary and Deputy of the Province of Hainault, and M. Thilquen, to be of the Council for the Affairs of the Auftrian Netherlands which is to be established The States General have ordered at Vienna. Yachts to be fent, to bring hither the Czar and his Confort; who are expected here to Morrow Night; and four Deputies are appointed to receive and compliment them on their Arrival. In the Circular Letter written by the Council of State; on Occasion of the Reform of the Troops propoled by the ex-traordinary Aliembly of the Deputies of the feveral Provinces, they reprefent, That the Socurity of the State and the Diminution of the publick Expence cannot be feparated from each other; that therefore the Reduction of the Forces ought to be as maturely confidered, as the easing the People in their Taxes ; that to difmifs fo many Companies of Swifs and Grifons, as has been proposed, is contrary to two folemn Treaties; and that the extraordinary Affembly had in an unufual Manner fent their Project to the respective Provinces, without confulting or communicating it first to the Council of State; who having fince the Beginning of December last written several Letters to the States of all the Provinces, touching the Reduction of the Forces and the better Regulation of the Finances, earnestly defire that the fame may be duely confidered and compared with the Project of the extraordinary Affembly, that fo upon the whole such Resolutions may be taken, as shall be judged most conducive to the Good of the State.
