TINCE the Carnival ended, 'tis computed that Forty Thousand Strangers are gone Officers who are returned to their Winter-Quarters, and are ordered to hold themfelves in Readiness to take the Field in April next. General Schulenbourg lets out next Week for the Levant; from whence 'tis advised, that the Turks are making very great Preparations, as if they defigned to make fome confiderable At-tempt on that Side. The Earl of Peterboyow left this Place on the 24th Instant, in order to go to Rome. This Morning died Sir Francis Bridgeman, who had been out of Eng-Jand 28 Years, and this Evening all the Bri-tish Merchants, and others of that Nation here, will attend his Funeral. On the 20th Gene-ral Schulenbourg dined with M. Cunningham, His Britannick Majeffy's Refident, together with the Lord Buiford and the Lord Naffaw Pawlet; and on the 22d, the fame Company were entertained by the Prince Royal of Poland. *Tis advifed from Rome, that the Elector of Bavaria has caufed a Prefent to be made to Don Carlo Albani, of a Diamond worth Five Hundred Piffoles; and that the Pope does particular Honours to his Sons the two Princes of Bavaria who lately arrived. Here are feveral Convoys making ready to fail to the Levant, one of them has already on board a confiderable Sum of Money, and large Stores of Ammu-nition and Provisions of all Sorts.

• Genoa, March 9, On the 2d of this Month an Englifh Merchant-Ship, Captain Metcalf Commander, happening to take Fire, a Quantity of Powder that was in the Cabin blew up, by which her Sides being opened, fhe prefently funk. She had in her Hold about an Hundred Batrels of Powder that lay with the Balaft, but by great Providence that Powder did not take Fire; if it had, the Port would have been deftroyed. About two Months ago a French Vefiel was loft in the like Manner. Thefe Accidents, which might have proved fo

deffructive to the Port, the Ships at Anchor, and the City itfelf, have determined this Republick to make a Law to oblige all Captains of Merchant-Men to fend their Powder afhore, before they come into the Harbour, ; but to preferve the Privilege of the Ships not being fearched, the Order is to be fent always to the Captains by the Conful of their Nation.

Berne; March 13. The Deputies of this State, who went lately to Neuville, a little Town on the Lake of Bienne in Comburgherihip with this Canton, to endeavour to reconcile the Magistrates and People of that Place who have been long at Variance, returned hither Yesterday, after having made there fuch Dispositions as may re-establish good Harmony, if the Bishop of Pointru who is their Prince, will acquiesce therein. The French Ambassador has not yet called a Dyet of all the Cantons as usual, to present his Credentials and be acknowledged by them, but it is faid he will do it foon after Easter. However, he acts as a Publick Minister, and has lately notified to the Cantons the Conclusion of the Treaty of Defensive Alliance between Great Britain, France and Holland.

Copenhagen, March 16. To Day the King fet out from hence, with Defign to fee the Preparations made on this Ifland, as well as on Laland, for maintaining conftantly a Number of Horfe on the Lands of his Majefty's own Demefnes: His Majefty is expected back in a Fortnight. The Ports in the Baltick have been fo frozen up till within thefe few Days, that it must have been very difficult for any Veffel to get out; fo that we have no frefh Accounts of the Condition of the Swedifh Fleet at Carlfcrona: The fitting out of ours is continued with all poffible Diligence. Friday laft being the Birth-Day of her Royal Highnefs the Princefs of Wales, the Lord Polwarth, His Britannick Majefty's Minifter here, treated on that Occafion the Principal Minifters, General Officers and Lords of the Court, as alfo all the Foreign Minifters refiding in this City.
