

- (d) amend the Tower Hamlets (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 so that the restrictions on waiting and loading "at any time" will apply in Royal Mint Street on the north side, between its junctions with Mansell Street and Leman Street,
- (e) amend the Tower Hamlets (Parking Places) (No 2) Order 1995, so that all the parking bays adjacent to the northern kerb-line of Royal Mint Street are revoked

WEYMOUTH AND PORTLAND BOROUGH COUNCIL

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990

Weymouth and Portland Borough Crescent Street Extension to the Weymouth Town Centres Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Weymouth and Portland Borough Council has included Crescent Street, Melcombe Place and parts of Lennox Street and Victoria Street in the Weymouth Town Centre Conservation Area under the provisions of the above Act

The effect of designation is that special attention will be paid by the Council to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area concerned, which is defined in the Schedule below. Future development or advertising in the Conservation Area will be subject to strict planning control designed to secure the preservation of the character and general improvement of the area, including alterations to unlisted buildings which will affect the character of the Conservation Area, where permitted development rights do not apply. Within the Conservation Area demolition of buildings or any part of a building will now require the approval of the Council as a Local Planning Authority, subject to certain exceptions.

In addition certain trees within the Conservation Area cannot be felled, topped or lopped or uprooted without the consent of the Weymouth and Portland Borough Council. If the trees are subject to wilful damage or wilful destruction an offence may have been committed.

The Borough Council will consider ways of improving or enhancing the Conservation Area through environmental enhancement schemes, subject to consultation with the public.

The boundary of the Conservation Area extends from 12 Crescent Street and 12 Queen Street to their junction with Stanley Street including the buildings facing Stanley Street between Crescent Street and Queen Street. The boundary also includes 20-24 Crescent Street, 19-37 Victoria Street, 1-11 Melcombe Street, 1-5 and 43-47 Lennox Street and 6 and 7 William Street.

Documents including the map showing the precise boundaries of the designated area, have been deposited at the office of the Chief Planning Officer at the Municipal Offices, North Quay, Weymouth and may be inspected during normal office hours.
