AN humble Address of the Mayor, Bailiffs, Burgeses, and other Inhabitants of Berwick upon Tweed, has been presented to His Majesty by Grey Nevil, and John Barrington, alias Shute, Esq; introduced by his Grace the Duke of Roxburghe, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Venice, April 2. Letters from Rome of the 27th of last Month give an Account, that General Schulenbourg on his Arrival there was lodged in the House of Sig. Duodo, Ambassadour of this Republick, and being admitted to an Audience of the Pope was received with the same Ceremonial that is allowed to Marshals of France and Grandees of Spain. The said General had acquainted the Pope with the true State of the Preparations of this Republick for the ensuing Campaign, and represented to him the Necessity of hastening the auxiliary Squadrons which are designed to act in Conjunction with the Venetian Fleet: And having thus dispatched the Business he had at Rome, his Excellency was preparing to set out from thence on the 28th for Otranto, in order to embark there for Corfu. During his Stay at Rome, he had been magnificently entertained by

several Cardinals and Ministers; and the Pope made him a Present. Sig. Molines had taken Leave of the Pope, and was on his Departure for Spain, there to act as Inquisitor General of that Kingdom. The Pretender being taken ill at Pefaro, the Pope has ordered his own Physician, Sig. Lancisi, to go thither and attend him. The Convoy which sailed lately for Dalmatia, was obliged by contrary Winds to put into the Ports of Itria; but to Day we received Advice of their having put to Sea again; and another Convoy is getting ready to sail shortly for Corfu. Sig. Sebastian Mocenigo has taken Leave of the Senate, in order to go to Dalmatia and take on him the Command of the Forces of this Republick there, in the Room of Sig. Angelo Emo.

Vienna, April 7. The Imperial Regiments in Hungary have begun to move from their several Quarters towards the Camp of Futack. The Electoral Prince of Bavaria, and one of his Brothers, design to make this Campaign under Prince Eugene. Some Vessels are ordered to Ratisbon, for the Service of the Dutchess of Blankenberg, Mother of the Empress Consort, who is coming hither against the Empress lyes in. His Imperial Majesty has appointed the Countess Dowager of Thurn, to be Governess of the Child of which the Empress shall be delivered.
