The Gweunydd Pendinas Nature Conservation Order 1998

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State made the Gweunydd Pendinas Nature Conscivation Order under section 29 of

the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (the Act) on 29th July 1998 The Order took effect on being made

The Order relates to land at Gweunydd Pendinas, Aberystwyth, Ceredigion, which is described in Schedule I to the Order

The general effect of the Order is to prohibit the operations specified in Schedule 2 to the Order, except when carried out in accordance with section 29(4) of the Act

The Order was unopposed and the Secretary of State has decided under paragraph 3(1) of Schedule 11 to the Act to take no action on it. The effect of the decision is that the Order will remain in effect

A copy of the Order and the map referred to in it have been deposited at the office of the Countryside Council of Wales, Plas Gogerddan, Aberystwyth, Ceredigion SY23 3EE They may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours

Any person who is aggreed by the Order and who desires to question its validity on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 29 of the Act or that the requirements of Schedule 11 to the Act have not been complied with in relation to it, may, within 6
