Vienna, April 24. On the 20th the Empt. rour gave the Investiture of the Electorate of Cologn, with the usual Ceremonies, to Count Blanckenheim, that Elector's Minister, fent hither for this Purpole, wherein it was observed that there was no mention made on either Side of former Quarrels. It's ex pected that the Investiture of Bavaria will be likewife foon given, but no Day is yet appointed for that Ceremony. The 21ft being the Empress Amalia's Birth day, it was observed at Court with the usual Solemnity, and all the Imperial Family dined publickly with her in her Apartment. The Emperour and Empress fet out on the 22d for Laxembourg, where they propole to stay about fix Weeks, unless the Empress be obliged to return fooner in order to lie in. Prince Eugene has declared he will fet out from hence on the 4th of next Month for Futack, where the Army is to rendezvous on the 12th, in

order to open the Campaign. Leipfick, April 29. The King of Poland continues fill here, but 'tis reported will return in a few Days to Drefden, and foon afterwards go to use the Waters of Carelsbadt.
