IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne, with the ufual Solemnity, Sir William Oldes, Gentleman-Ulher of the Black-Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to make the following most Gracious Speech to both Houses.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

IT is with great Satisfaction that after this short Recess I can acquaint you with the certain Advice I have received, that my Fleet is safely arrived in the Sound, which by the Bleffing of Almighty God will fecure thefe Kingdoms against any immediate Danger of an Invasion.

I have, by this Means, an Opportunity, which is very acceptable to me, of making a confiderable Reduction in our Land Forces, having a conjuterable Reduction in our Land Forces, having established it as a Rule with my felf, to confult the Ease of my People in every Thing, so far as u con fistent with their Safety. And, for my own Part, as I shall always place my Greatness in the Prosperity of my Subjects, so I shall always de-line that my Power may be founded in their Af fire that my Power may be founded in their Af. festions.

It is upon these Considerations that I have given Orders for the immediate reducing of Ten Thousand Men

That nothing may be wanting in me to quiet the Minds of all my Subjects, I have likewife given Directions to prepare an Alt of Grace; and however it may be received by those who are obstinately bent on the Ruin of their Country, I promife my felf, that it will raife a due Senfe of Gratitude in all fuch as have been artfully mif-lead into Treafonable Prasters against my Perfon and Government, and preferve them from stand-ing in need of the like Mercy for the future, when fuch an Instance of Clemency may not be so expedient for the publick Welfare, as it would be agreeable to my own Inclinations.

. Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I thank you for your Readiness to support me in the present JunEture of Affairs, and for the Supplies which you have given; and do promise you that they shall be employed for the Uses to make you defend alow which you designed them.

I shall order such faithful Accompts to be laid before you the next Seffion, as will make it appear, there was no other View in asking any particular Supply, than to prevent a much greater Expence, which the Nation must have unavoidably incurred without it.

I must recommend to you, as I did at the Beginning of the Seffion, to take all proper Methods for reducing the publick Debts, with a just Regard to Parliamentary Credit.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

The Year being fo far advanced, I hope you will go through the publick Business with all possible Dispatch and Unanimity, it being my Intention to meet you early the next Winter, that the fitting of Parliament may be brought into the more usual and convenient Sea (on.

An humble Address of the Bayliffs and Burgesses of the Borough of Bridport in the County of Dorset, has been presented to His Majesty by William Coventry and Peter Walter, Elgs; their Representatives in Parliament, introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Houlehold, in the Absence of his Grace the Duke of Bolton, Lord Lieutenant of the County of Dorlet.

An humble Address of the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, and Justices of the Peace, met at the Grand Seffions held at Brecon for that County on the 29th of March, 1717. Prefent-ed to His Majefty by Roger James, Elgs Member of Parliament for the Borough of Brecon, introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord, Carteret, one of the Gentlemen of His Mas jefty's Bed-Chamber.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very gracioufly.

Vienna, April 28. The Letters from Buda, of the 24th Inftant fay, hat the Baron de Petrasch, a famous Partizan, going from Peterwaradin down the Danube, with a great Num-ber of Boats laden with Provisions and Ammunition, and defigned for the Ule of the Garrifon of Temeswaer, was attack'd by fome-Turkish Veffels near the Place where the Tibiscus falls into the Danube, and after a vigorous Defence, was himself made Prifoner by them, and 20 of his Boats taken; however, the reft of them, being a much greater Number, escaped, and were brought back to Peterwaradin, from whence they are fetting out again under a stronger Convoy. M. Fleischman, the Emperour's late Refident in Turkey, is made one of the Commissioners of the Council of War, in Confideration of his Services and Sufferings there. The Emperor has at last promised to the Republick of Genoa, the Investiture of the Marquifate of Final, which is accordingly foon to be given to their Minister here. And at the same Time his Imperial Majefty has confented to an Alteration of the Treaty made at Milan, for the Paffage of Salt through the Territories of that Republick.

Bern, May 1. The Diet called by the French Ambaffadour the Marquels d'Avarey for his Reception, met on the 25th paft at Soleurre. The Ambaffadour having cauled his Speech to be read by M. de Martiniere, Secretary of the French Embaffy, was com

complimented by one of the Deputies of Zurich, at the Head of those of the 13 Cantons; after which the Ambaffadour treated the Deputies and their Retinue, which confifted of about 120 Perfons, at three feveral Tables, and the next Day the fame Company was treated by the City of Soleurre. This State has fent two Deputies to St. Gall, to inquire into the Thefts and other Diforders committed in the Chappel of that Convent, whereof a Citizen of Bern, with some others, stands accused by the Monks.

Hague, May 11. Yesterday M. Mein-derschagen notified to the States Gene-ral the Birth of a young Prince of Prul-fia on the fecond Instant. The fame Day Mr. Whitworth gave in His Majefty's Answer to the States Letter, notifying the Neceffity they were in to disband the two Scotch Regiments of Douglass and Wood. Baron Gortz has prefented a Peti-tion to the States of Guelderland affembled at Zutphen, and the 8th Infrant Count Reventlau, the Holftein Minister, who was gone thither, delivered likewise a Memorial in his Behalf; but they have both been referred hither for the Confideration of the States General, without any other Anfwer. The King of Pruffia is expected at Cleves the latter End of this Month, and was to leave Ber-lin the 20th Instant. It has been resolved, in answer to some Representations of the Pruffian Minister, that the Arrears due shall be paid on the Terms fixed in ready Money, and without any Abatement for Counter-pretensions; though at the same Time the States will earneftly follicit the King of Pruffia for what is due to them for the Quarter of Guelder in his Poffeffion, which amounts to 160000 Florins: The Payments are to be made out of the Office of the Generality, but the States will take Care that it be punctual. M. Pefters has fent a Project of the Alterations to be made in the separate Article about the Subfidy of 50000 Dollars, for the Con-fideration of the States General.

Paris, May 12. On the 7th Inftant, between nine and ten at Night the Czar arriwed here, and was conducted to the Apart-ments of the Old Louvre, which had been fitted up for his Reception, but he choic to remove from thence, and lodge at the Hôtel de Lesdiguieres, belonging to the Marshal de Villeroy. The next Morning the Regent made him a Visit, was received by the Czar at the Door within his Chamber, and they were in Conference about an Hour. On the 10th the King made a Vifit to his Czarish Majesty, and was received by him at the Foot of the Stairs; Yesterday in the Afternoon the Czar returned the Vifit, and was received by the The King King with the fame Ceremony. of Pruffia is expected here towards the End of this Month. Letters from Madrid advife, that Prince Francis died there on the 21ft, being a Month old, and on the 23d that Court went into Mourning.
