## Rome, April 27.

ON Joseph Molines, formerly eldest Auditor of the Rota, fet out from hence on the 18th of this Month for Spain, where he is to act as Grand Inquifitor of that Kingdom. On the 19th Cardi-nal Gualtiero had an Audience of the Pope, and prefented to him a Letter of Compliments from the Preten-der. The fame Evening Cardinal Ac-quaviva received Difpatches by an extraordinary Courier from Spain, advising that some new Difficulties had rifen which would obstruct the Accommodation of the Differences between this Court and that of Madrid, where it had been refolved that Sig. Pompeo Aldrovandi the Pope's Nuncio, who was known to be on his Way from hence thither, fhould be forbid to enter that Kingdom. On the 20th Cardinal Acquaviva defired an Audience of the Pope, but not obtaining it, he communicated his Difpatches to Cardinal Paulucci, Secretary of State. At the fame Time came Letters from Genoa, by which the Regents of that Republick excufed them-felves from fending the two Gallies that had been promifed to join the Pope's for this Summer's Service against the Turks, that State being obliged to referve all its Force for its own Security. On the 23d the Venetian Ambassadour made preffing Inftances to the Pope, to induce him to haften by his Sollici-

tations the Auxiliary Squadrons expected from Spain, Portugal and other Parts, acquainting him with the diligent Preparations which the Republick had made for having their Fleet at Sea before the Turks had got all their naval Forces together. The Earl of Peterborough having paffed fome Weeks here, went away two Days ago. Vienna, May 8. About the Middle of

last Month Baron Petrasch, Lieutenant Collonel of the Regiment of Schonborn, who had lately fignalized himfelf by making fome fuccefsful Excursions with Parties, was ordered to go with a Num-ber of Barks and Saicks, laden with Provisions and Ammunition, from Peterwaradin into the Tibifcus, whence that Convoy was to proceed to Panzova: He was to have been joined by fome Frigates which had winter'd in the Port of Bilibert near Effeck; but they not coming fo foon as he ex-pected, he passed down the Danube on the 17th, not knowing the Turks had formed a Defign to intercept him: They had brought their Frigates well armed to the Mouth of the Tibifcus, and when the Imperial Veffels appeared they attack'd them with great Vigour : Baron Petrasch made a very brave Defence, and gave Time to the Barks to put back to Peterwaradin, but the Enemy funk or took twenty of the Saicks, and he himfelf was made Prisoner and carried to Belgrade. On the 18th M. Schwendiman with the Imperial Frigates

gates arrived at Peterwaradin; and other Transports with the like Lading of Provisions and Ammunition being foon got ready, he passed down the Danube with them into the Tibifcus, and to Day came Letters from Verlez in the Diffrict of Temeswaer, dated the 28th paft, advising, that this Convoy got all fafe to Panzova.

Midrid, May 10. On the 1ft Inftant, being the Festival of St. Philip, whose Name the King bears, there was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility at Court, and his Majefty received the usual Compliments; on which Occasion the Mourning for the late Infant-Prince was laid aside. The King went afterwards into the great Hall of the Palace, and performed the Ceremony of giving the Collar of the Order of the Golden Fleece to the Prince of Afturias, in the Presence of the Duke de Bejar, the Marquess de Villena, the Count de Lemos, the Marquels de Risbourg, the Marquess de Crevecoeur, the Duke d'Albuquerque, the Duke of Liria, and the Marquels de Quelus, Knights-Companions of that Order. The Queen and the Infantes were at this Ceremony, which being over, the King, accompanied by the Prince, and preceded by the Knights, the Officers of his Houfehold, and the Kings of Arms, went to the Chapel where Mafs was faid by The next the Patriarch of the Indies. Day their Majefties and the Prince fet out for Segovia. Since their Departure a Decree has been published, by which a great many Perfons who ferved in the Offices belonging to the Councils of the Treasury and of the Indies, are disimissed their Employments. And by another Decree feveral Perfons of Quality of both Sexes, who in 1710 reforted to the Army of the Allies, are ordered to go and refide at different Places in Castile and Galicia, and not to depart the Places affigned them for their Residence without the King's Leave. Purfuant to this Decree, the Countefs d'Oropefa is to repair to Valladolid, the Countels of Palma to Palencia, and Don Luis de Cordova, Brother of the Duke of Medina-Celi, to Burgos.

Paris, May 26. On the 21st in the Evening the Czar went to the Palace of Luxembourg to make a Visit to the Dutchefs of Berry. The Swifs with their Halbards were placed on the Stairs, at the Foot of which the Czar was received by the Captain of the Dutchefs's Guards, and being conducted to her Apartment, was met by her at the Door of her Chamber: After a fhort Stay there, the Dutchels walked with him into the great Gallery painted by Rubens, and thence into fome of the other Apartments, after which he took his Leave of her. On the 22d his Czarish Majesty went to St. Clou, where the Duke Regent entertained him, and on his Way back hither he faw the French and Swifs Guards perform their Exercife. On the 23d his Czarish Majefty went to Verfailles, and after fome Days Stay there will go to Marly.

Whitehall, May 20. His Majefty has been pleafed to appoint Dr. John Turner to be Prebend of Canterbury.
