

CLEETHORPES CENTRAL SEA FRONT CONSERVATION AREA

Notice is hereby given that on 12th August 1998, North East Lincolnshire Borough Council, as the local planning authority, resolved to extend the Cleethorpes Central Sea Front Conservation Area to include various properties in High Street, Station Road, Cuttleby, Albert Road, St Peter's Avenue, Yarra Road, Station Approach, Knoll Street Sea View Street, Cambridge Street, New Road, North Promenade and Central Promenade, Cleethorpes, North East Lincolnshire

The effect of the Council's Resolution on properties within the extended Conservation Area is generally as follows

The demolition of certain buildings is brought within Conservation Area control.

2 It becomes an offence to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in the area unless consent has been obtained from the Council or 6 weeks prior notice of the works was given to the Council and the works are carried out within 2 years of the notice and the tree is not the subject of a Tree Preservation Order,

3 The Council will be under a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the area,

4 The Council are under a duty to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area when exercising their powers under the Planning Acts, 5 Planning applications for development which would, in the opinion

of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the area must be given publicity

6 Permitted development rights under the Town & County Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 are more restricted than in other areas,

7 Specific statutory duties are imposed on telecommunications operators,

8 The right to display certain types of illuminated advertisement without express consent is excluded,

9 Grants or loans may be available for certain purposes from the Historic Buildings and Monuments Commission for England
